Deep water was reported on State Highway 293.

A deep trough across the western United States pulled copious amounts of tropical Pacific moisture across the region. This interacted with an approaching frontal boundary to produce widespread showers and thunderstorms in the area. These storms produced heavy rainfall which led to minor flooding across the southwest and south-central Texas Panhandle in the morning hours and minor flooding over the central Texas Panhandle during the evening.

An unusually cold early season air mass combined with an upper-level storm system to produce a widespread snow event across the Texas Panhandle during the afternoon and evening hours. The highest snowfall totals were across the northeast and central parts of the Texas Panhandle, where amounts of 6 inches or more were reported. Other Texas Panhandle counties received anywhere from 1 to 6 inches of snow.
