I Dreamed I Was Cloud Watching . .

If you were one of the thousands of Cedar Rapids people who were keeping a wary eye on the skies Wednesday evening you were treated to a meteorological rarity which you may possibly never see again—Cumulonimbus Mammatus. Also referred to as Mammato-cumulus, it is a cumulonimbus cloud formation having heavy, pouchlike protuberances beneath. They occur only when violent storms are in the area and then only briefly. They provided a real thrill for Mrs. Justin Huber, 1018 Nineteenth street SE, an amateur meteorologist, who had seen them only once before, 10 years ago in Oklahoma. Charles Pope Convicted by Federal Jury

A Cedar Rapids man Wednesday night was found guilty on two counts and acquitted of four other charges in a federal indictment charging him with using the mails to defraud.

Sentencing of Charles W. Pope, 37, of 2020 Glass road NE, will follow a background study by the court's probation department. He remains free on \$1,000 bond.

The jury, which began deliberations in the case at 2:45 p.m. Tuesday, returned its verdict at 6 p.m. Wednesday. Pope was found guilty on counts four and six.

The indictment accused Pope of devising a scheme to collect false insurance claims from three insurance companies. However, counts four and six involve only the Monarch Life Insurance Co. of Springfield, Mass.

Count four charged Pope with causing Monarch to mail to him checks for \$500 and \$400 on Feb. 11, 1964. Count six states he caused Monarch to mail him checks for \$500 and \$520 April 8, 1964, both payable to Pope and Stanley M. Nielsen, an attorney.

Other counts had involved payments received from Ohio State Life Insurance Co. of Columbus, Ohio, and Central Mutual Life of Van Wert, Ohio. Pope was injured in an auto accident Jan. 7, 1963.

Maximum sentence on each count is a \$1,000 fine or five years in prison, or both. The trial opened May 6.

The elephant seal, said a zoologist, is "not vicious ordinarily. However, if you irritate them, they will snap."

BOSTON (AP) — Mayor Kevin White has unveiled a set of new programs for the city's slum areas which begins with \$30 million in loans from banks and insurance companies. The money, more than half of it expected within one year, would go for rehabilitation of existing slum housing, and to build new low-income housing.

But for 20 years I have tried to find peace in that bathroom—and it simply can't be done.

Every American boy is inspired by the fact he has a chance to grow up and become President of the United States—or at least earn enough money to have a bathroom of his very own.

That's why so many husbands today are running for the White House. They think that with all the bathrooms it is they'll surely be allowed to claim one as their very own. This is unlikely, particularly in the case of Senator Robert Kennedy, who has an 11th child on the way. If he yearns for a bathroom of his own, he'd do better to forget the White House and set his sights on taking over the Pentagon.

"Eternal Pilgrim"

It seems a law of modern life that, no matter how many bathrooms a home may have, it never has one for the husband. He remains an eternal pilgrim in his own abode.

When I graduated to a two-bathroom apartment two decades ago, I patted the tiled walls in joy. I thought that at last I had achieved one of my lifelong dreams—a stall shower of my own, a place where I could come and sit and brood and fill out my income tax returns undisturbed.

It was to be my private ivory tower, my monk's cell, my

hermitage, my retreat from the world that seems always too much with us.

Cruel Delusion

What a delusion! Why, if I had invented a better mousetrap, the world couldn't have beaten a quicker path to the doorway of that bathroom.

It started with a simple question from Frances, my wife: "You don't mind if I hang a few stockings to dry in your stall shower, do you?"

"No, of course not," I answered. I was like the kindly Arab who let the camel stick its nose into his tent to get warm and soon found himself crowded out by the animal.

Female Takeover

My bathroom is now a forest of bottled lady lotions and dripping feminine finery. It has become a laundry for Frances and our teen-age daughter, Tracy Ann.

They wash their hair there, too, do their fingernails there, and use it as a conference room to cook up family plots against me.

Our cat, Lady Dottie, now also has her box in my bathroom. Where else? Believe me, friend, you may have had trouble in your life, but you don't know what trouble is until, on a harried Monday morning, you

rush into a stall shower and stub your toe on a steel pan full of moist cat gravel.

A Little Peace

Now, when someone knocks on my bathroom door, I never know whether it'll be a member of the family, a visiting Elk, the neighborhood seissors grinder, or a kid selling Girl Scout cookies.

But whoever it is, each asks the same thing in a tone of complaint and accusation: "What are you doing in there?"

What am I doing in there? I'm doing what those diplomats are doing in Paris. Just trying to find a little peace.

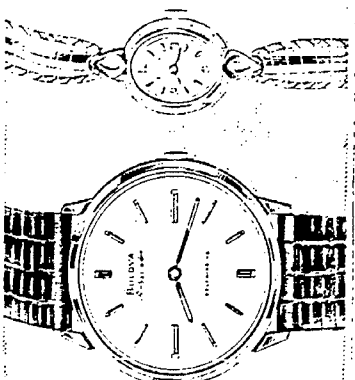
