Wheat, Corn, Bean Prices

CHICAGO (AP) — Soybeans and grain futures prices were fractionally mixed in early dealing today on the Board of Trade.

Wheat firmed somewhat after a weak opening on reports that some buying could be anticipated for export to Brazil.

A government report showed that soybean crushings declined somewhat in April. Nearby contracts in soybean oil opened higher. However, soybean prices were mixed.

The carryover of corn Oct. 1 is forecast at about 1.15 billion bushels compared with 823 million bushels last October.

Dow Jones Industrials Up 6.19

NEW YORK (AP)—The stock market mounted a solid rally this afternoon, with trading active.

Pont-up cash reserves of institutional investors were being pumped into the market, analysts said, accounting for a major part of the rally.

The Associated Press average of 60 stocks at noon was up 2.3 at 331.9, with industrials up 2.7, rails up 2.9 and utilities off 5.

Softness in utilities and other "yield" stocks was accompanied by further easing in U.S. Treasury bonds as new reports of rising interest rates was received.

Gains of fractions to around 3 points were spotted among the list of key stocks, but higher-priced issues made larger gains.

The Dow Jones industrial average at noon was up 6.19 at 902.51—reversing the supposed psychological barrier of the 900 line.

In the over-all stock list, gains outnumbered losses by nearly 8 to 3.
