**An upper level trough moving across the Middle Mississippi River Valley Region took on a negative tilt and produced a QLCS that impacted the Central Gulf Coast States. The QLCS produced sporadic wind damage as it moved across Central Alabama. Precipitable water values were abnormally high and the slow moving system produced storm totals of 3-4 inches across areas west of I-65. Localized storms totals were near 6 inches.**

National Weather Service meteorologists surveyed damage in extreme southwest Montgomery County and determined that the damage was consistent with an EF0 tornado, with maximum sustained winds near 80 mph. The tornado touched down just east of Philadelphia Church Road, northeast of Lapine and west of Grady. The tornado tracked northeastward and crossed Philadelphia Church Road and Naftel Ramer Road. The tornado lifted just after it crossed Smiley Ferry Road. Several trees were uprooted or snapped along the damage path. The most concentrated area of damage was just as the tornado was lifting near Smiley Ferry Road, but still limited to tree damage.

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A narrow path of wind damage was surveyed at the Little Mountain Marina northeast of Guntersville. The path begins at the lake shore where a tree was uprooted. Marina buildings suffered minor damage; several windows were broken and some roofing was torn off. Several tree branches were broken and small tree trunks (all 6 inches in diameter or less) were snapped, and a flagpole and a TV antenna were bent. Witnesses reported seeing a "waterspout without water" form over Lake Guntersville and move ashore, causing the damage. Another witness noted that the "waterspout" formed "along the cold front". All of the eyewitness accounts note that it occurred without any rain.

**A line of thunderstorms pushed east into northwest and north central Alabama during the early and mid morning hours of the 14th and tracked into northeast Alabama during the early afternoon hours. Isolated reports of wind damage were received. A storm survey was needed to assess a narrow path of damage at a marina northeast of Guntersville in Marshall County.**
