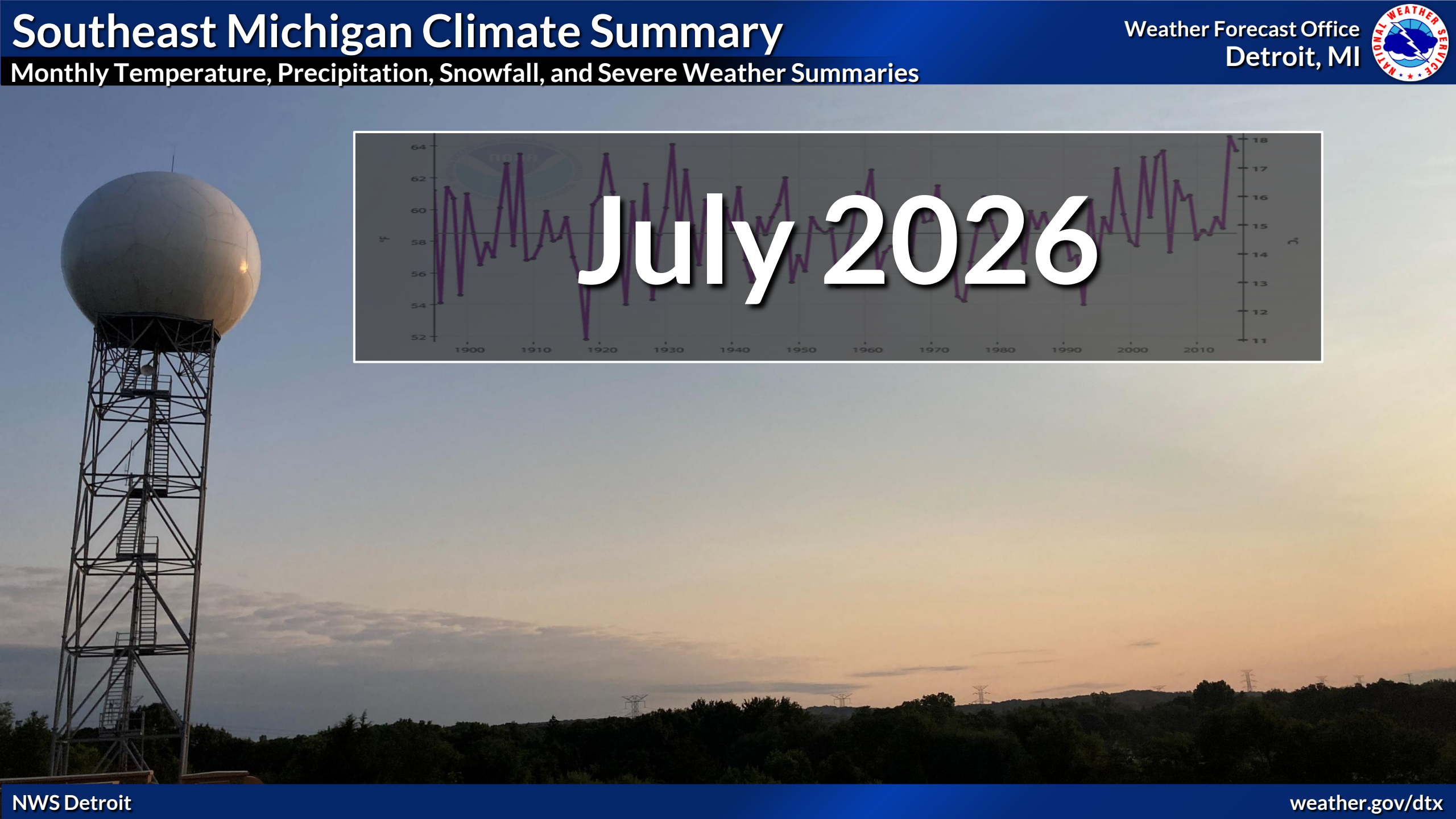

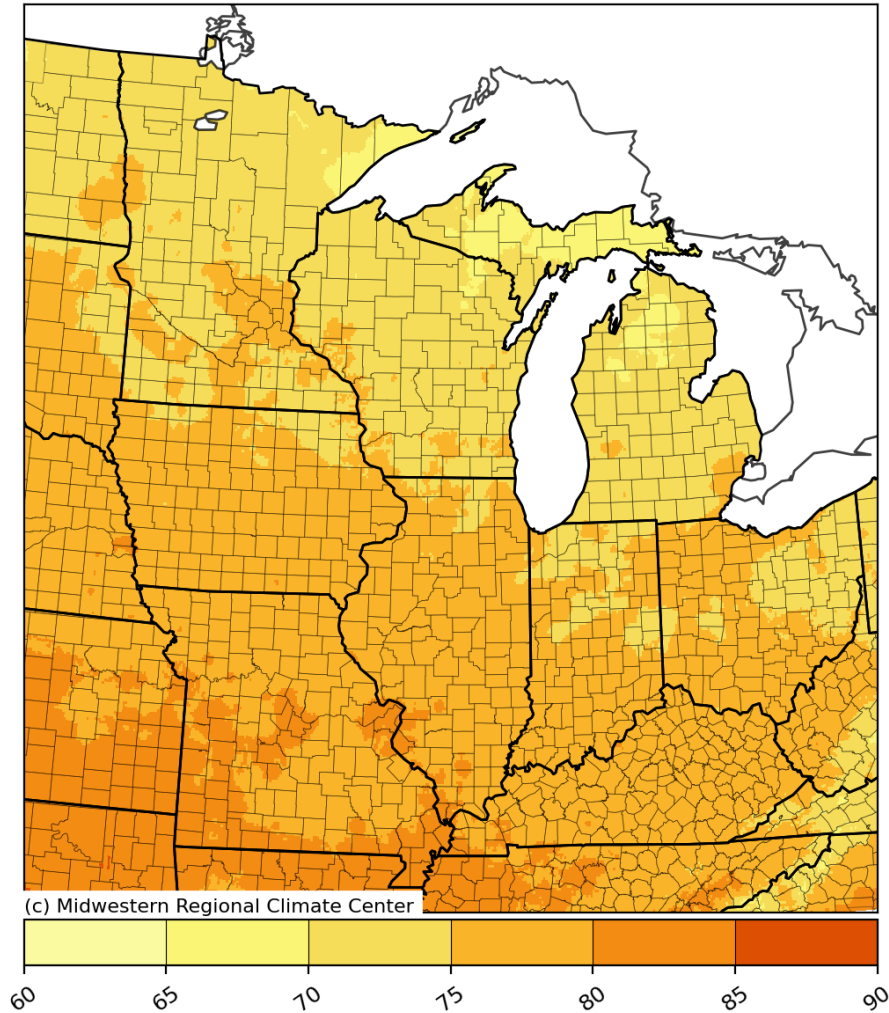

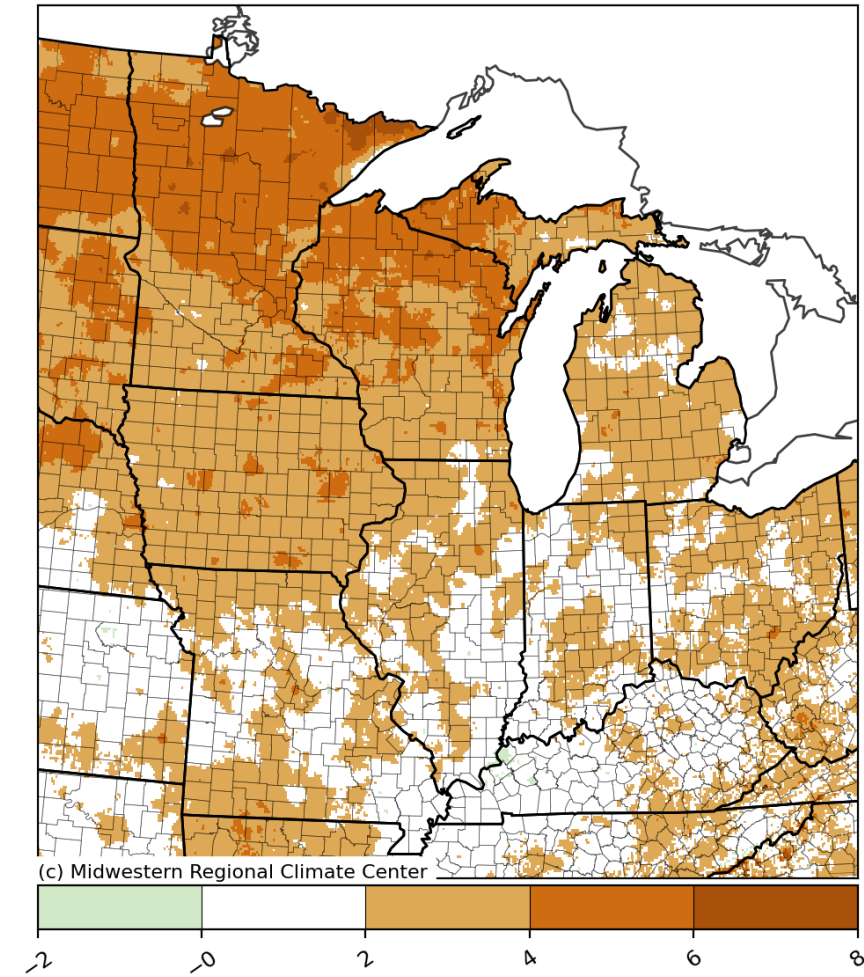

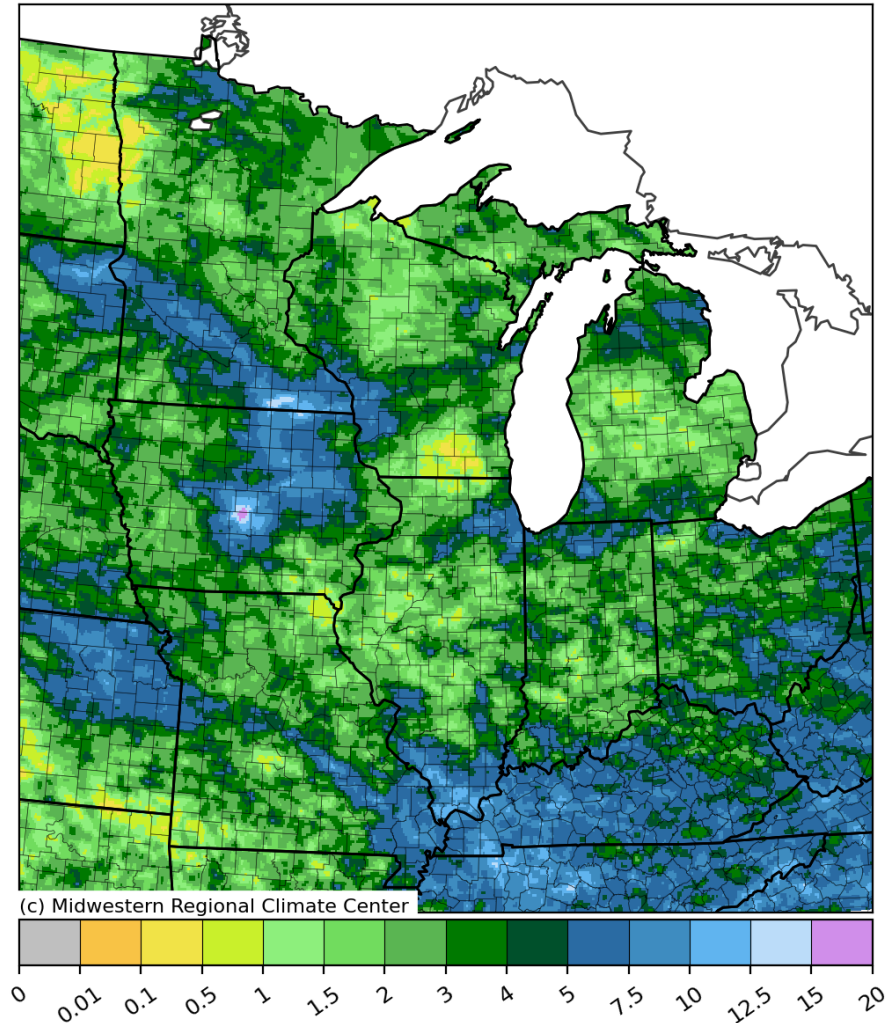

July 01, 2026 to July 31, 2026

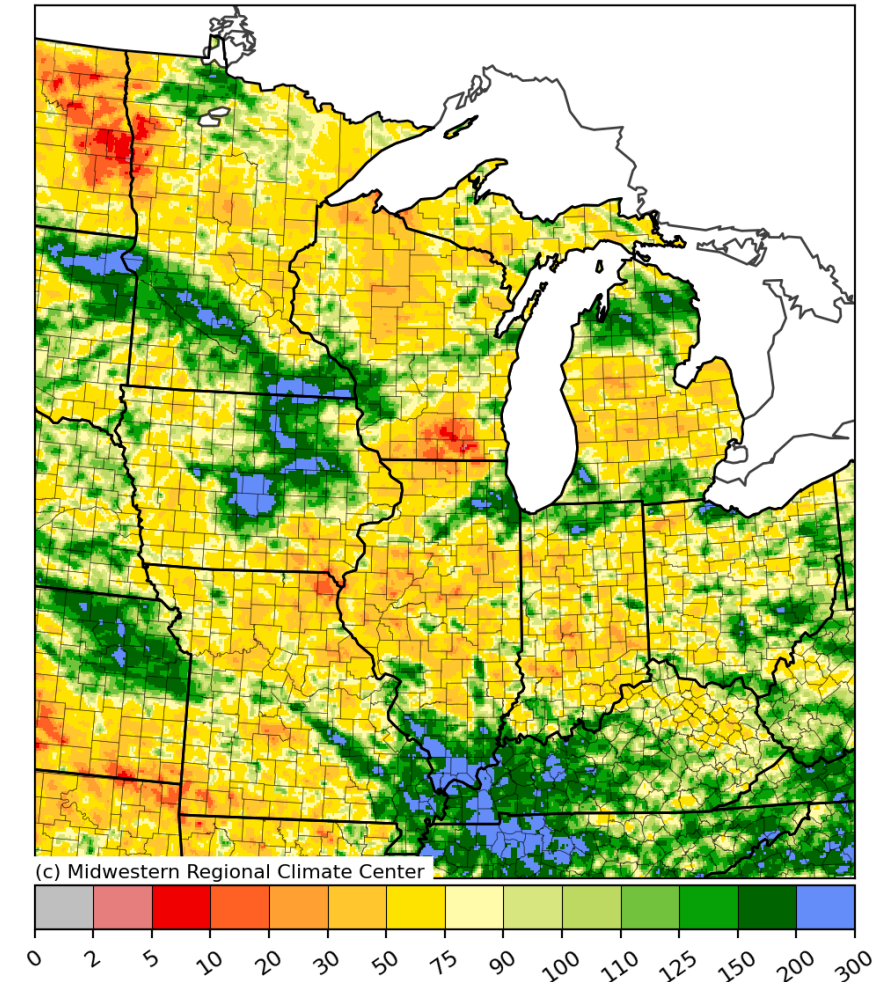

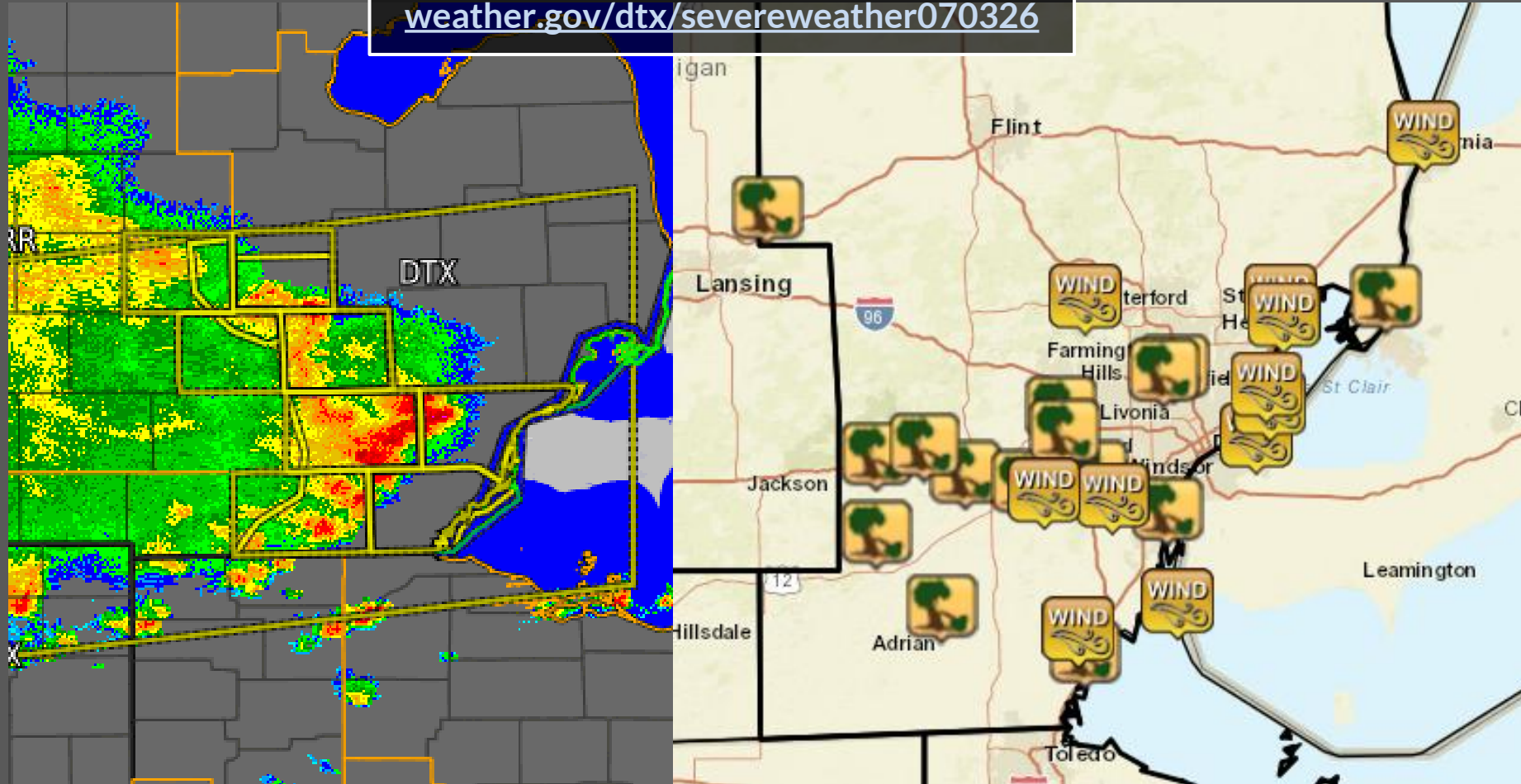

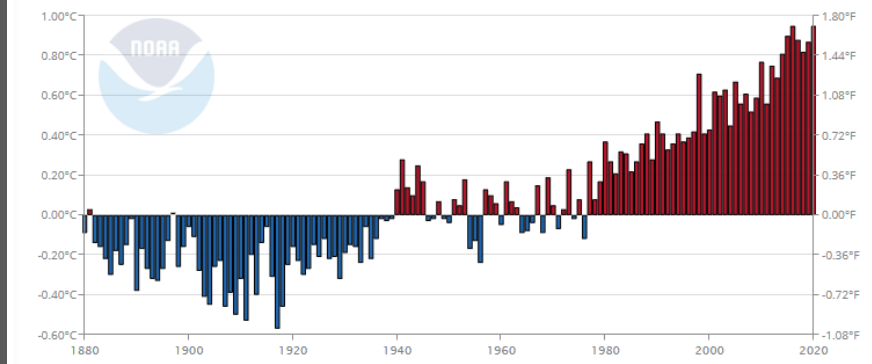
