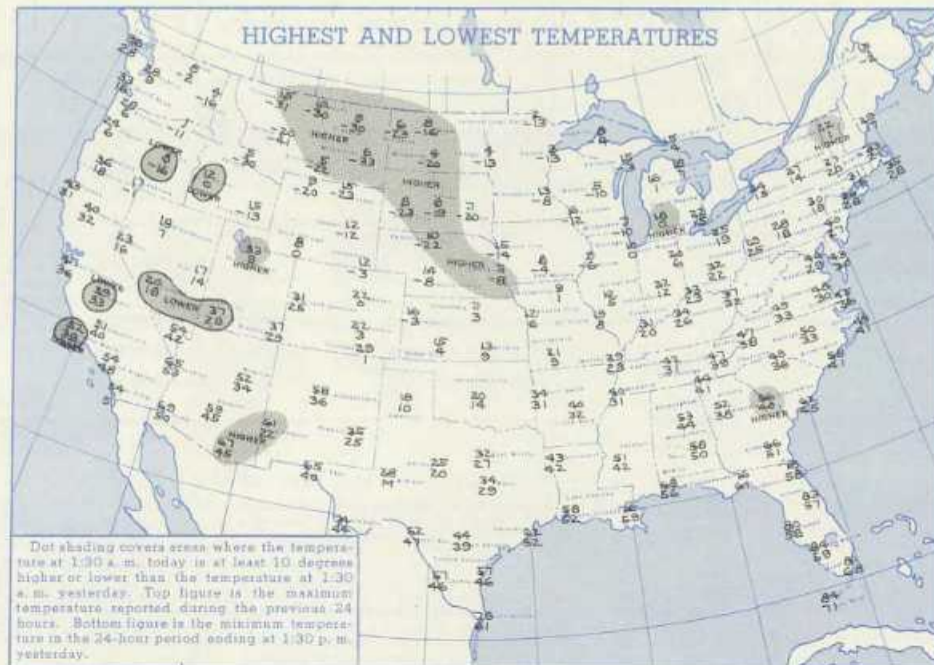
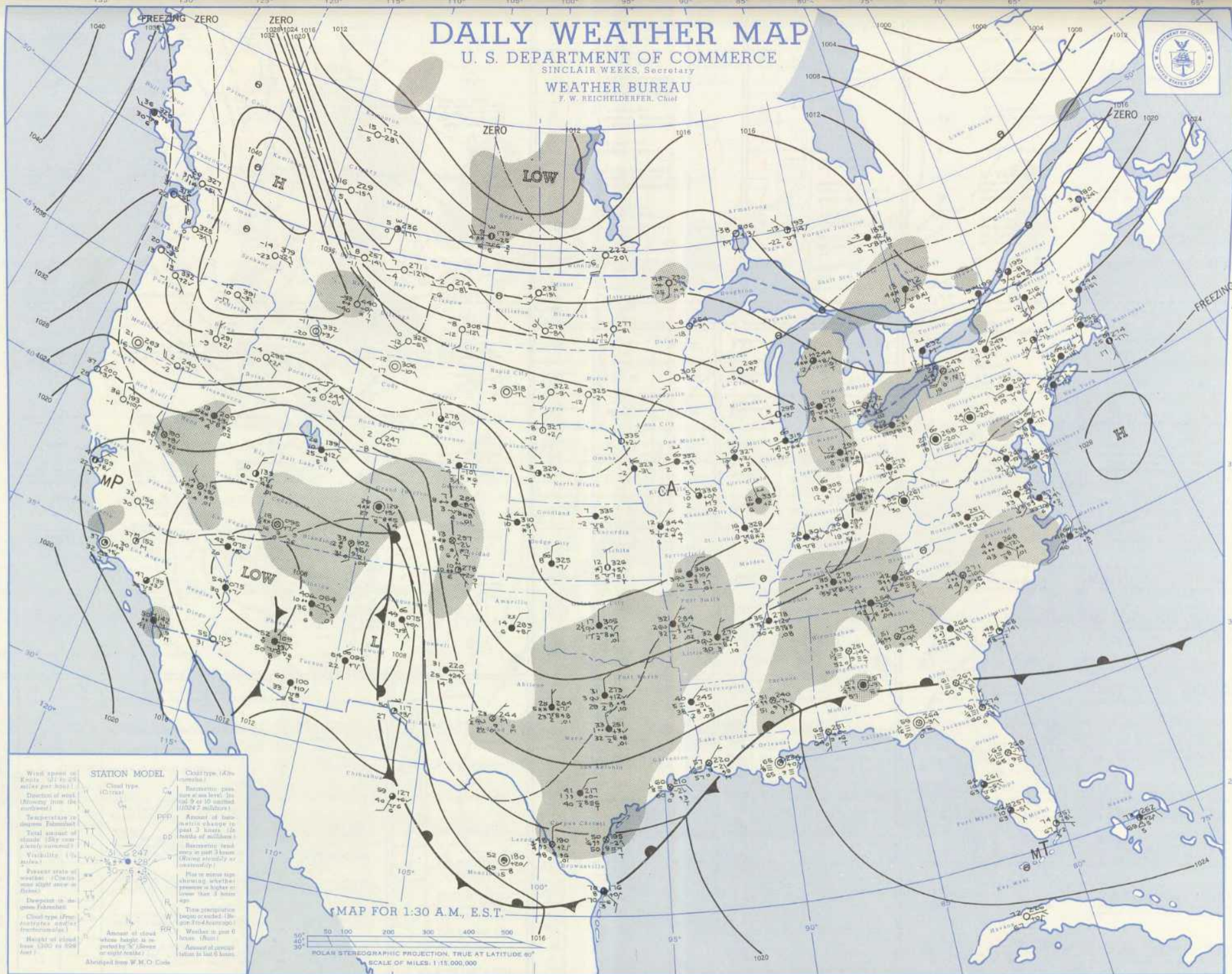
DISTRICT OF COLUMBIA AND VICINITY, cloudy with occasional rain, highest around 40° today; cloudy with some rain or snow likely tonight and Monday, lowest tonight around 30°.

MARYLAND, cloudy with occasional rain in the south and rain or snow in the north and west portions today, highest in the 40's, except in the 30's in the west portion; cloudy with occasional rain in the southeast and rain or snow elsewhere, except snow or snow flurries in the west portion tonight and Monday, lowest tonight 35° to 40° in the southeast and 25° to 34° elsewhere.

VIRGINIA, cloudy with occasional rain or snow in the mountains, highest mostly in the 40's, except 30° to 35° in the mountains today; cloudy with occasional rain in the southeast and rain or snow in the west and north portions tonight and Monday, lowest tonight 35° to 40° in the southeast and 26° to 34° in the west and north portions.

DELAWARE, cloudy with occasional rain today, except possibly snow changing to rain in New Castle County, highest in the 40's; cloudy with occasional rain in the south and rain or snow in the north portion tonight and Monday, lowest tonight 28° to 34° in the north and 34° to 38° in the south portion.

A complete explanation of the Daily Weather Map appears on the reverse side on Sunday of each week. Special articles relating to weather, when available, are published on other days.



THE MAPS shown here are prepared from observations taken daily at hundreds of stations throughout North America. The observations taken at 1:30 a. m. E.S.T., at approximately two hundred selected stations are inscribed on the large surface map of the United States, southern Canada, northern Mexico, and Cuba.

A complete explanation of these maps (including all symbols and tables) is printed frequently on the reverse side. Periodically, during each month, climatological charts and graphs appear in place of the Explanation; and, occasionally, illustrated articles of special meteorological interest are published.
