THURSDAY, JANUARY 31, 1957

DISTRICT OF COLUMBIA AND VICINITY, wet snow will accumulate several inches, then turn to rain this morning, highest this afternoon 37°; rain ending late tonight, lowest 35°; Friday clearing and a bit warmer.

MARYLAND, snow changing to rain in the south portion this morning and in the north portion during the afternoon, snow and slush accumulations will reach 2 to 4 inches, rain this afternoon and tonight, high temperatures today 33° to 38° in the north and 38° to 44° in the south portion, low temperatures tonight 33° to 37° in the north and 35° to 40° in the south portion; Friday clearing and milder.

VIRGINIA, rain in the south and several inches of snow accumulating before turning to rain in the north portion, highest 35° to 40° today; rain ending during the night, lowest 35° to 40°; Friday clearing and somewhat warmer.

DELAWARE, snow changing to rain before noon and rain this afternoon and tonight with snow and slush accumulations 2 to 4 inches, high temperatures today 35° to 40°, low temperatures tonight in the upper 30's; Friday clearing and milder.

THE MAPS shown here are prepared from observations taken daily at hundreds of stations throughout North America. The observations taken at 1:30 a. m. E. S. T., at approximately two hundred selected stations are inscribed on the large surface map of the United States, southern Canada, northern Mexico, and Cuba.
