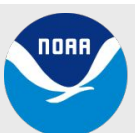

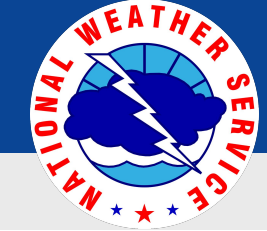

- Thunderstorms are expected, a few of which will be capable of producing localized damaging wind gusts and scattered instances of flash flooding.

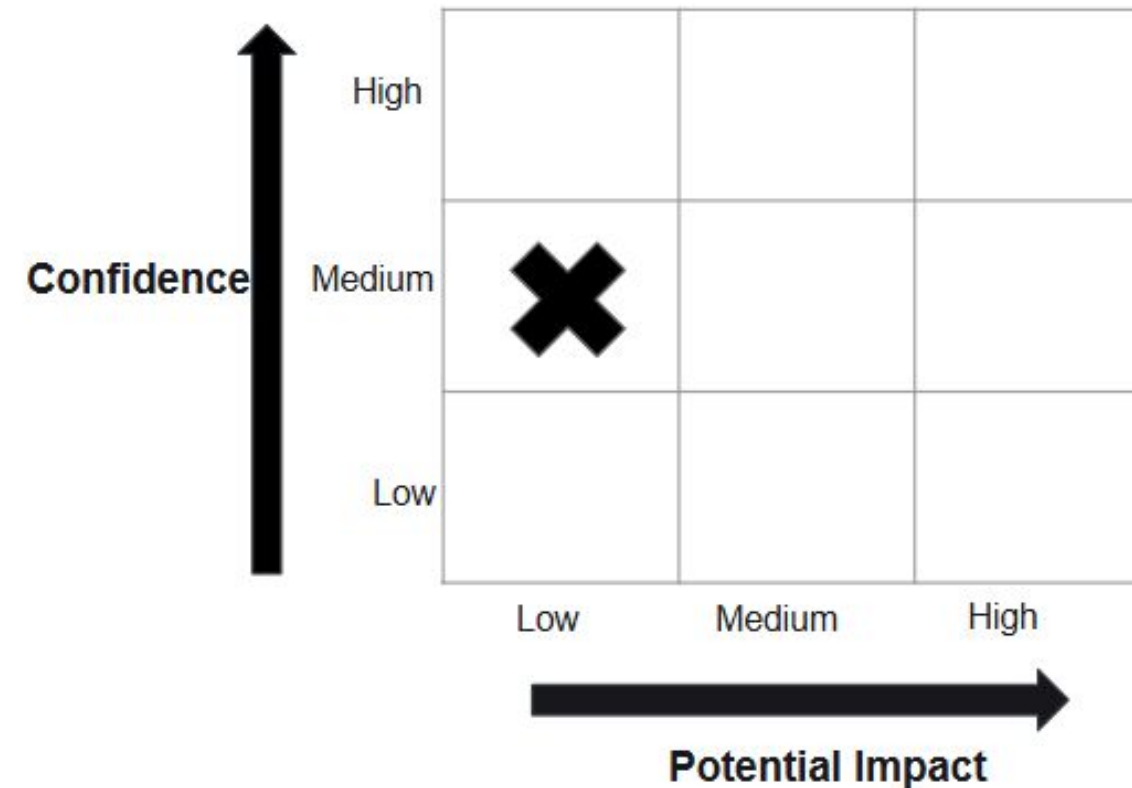
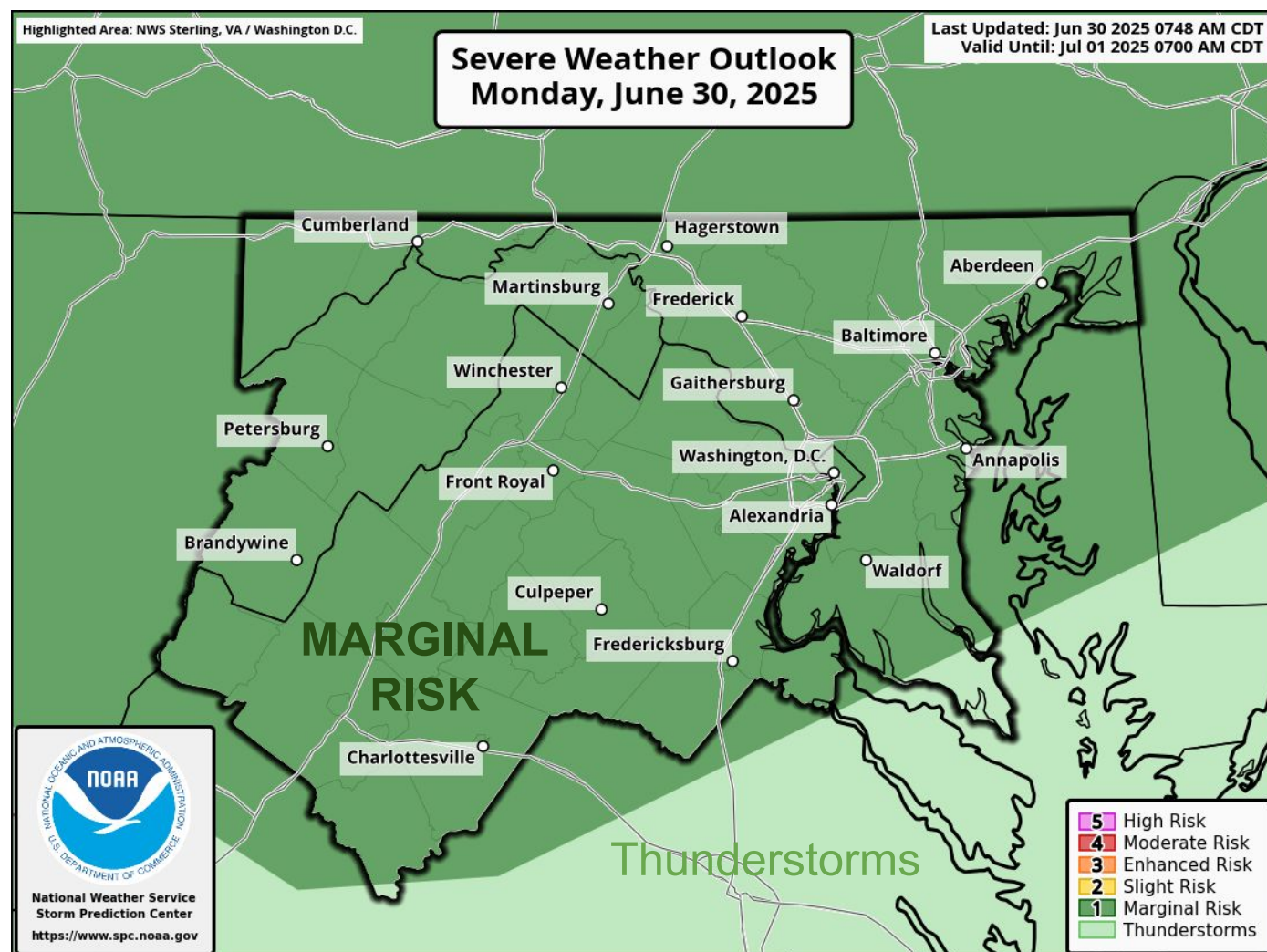

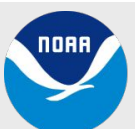


- **Threats**

- 2 PM and 10 PM

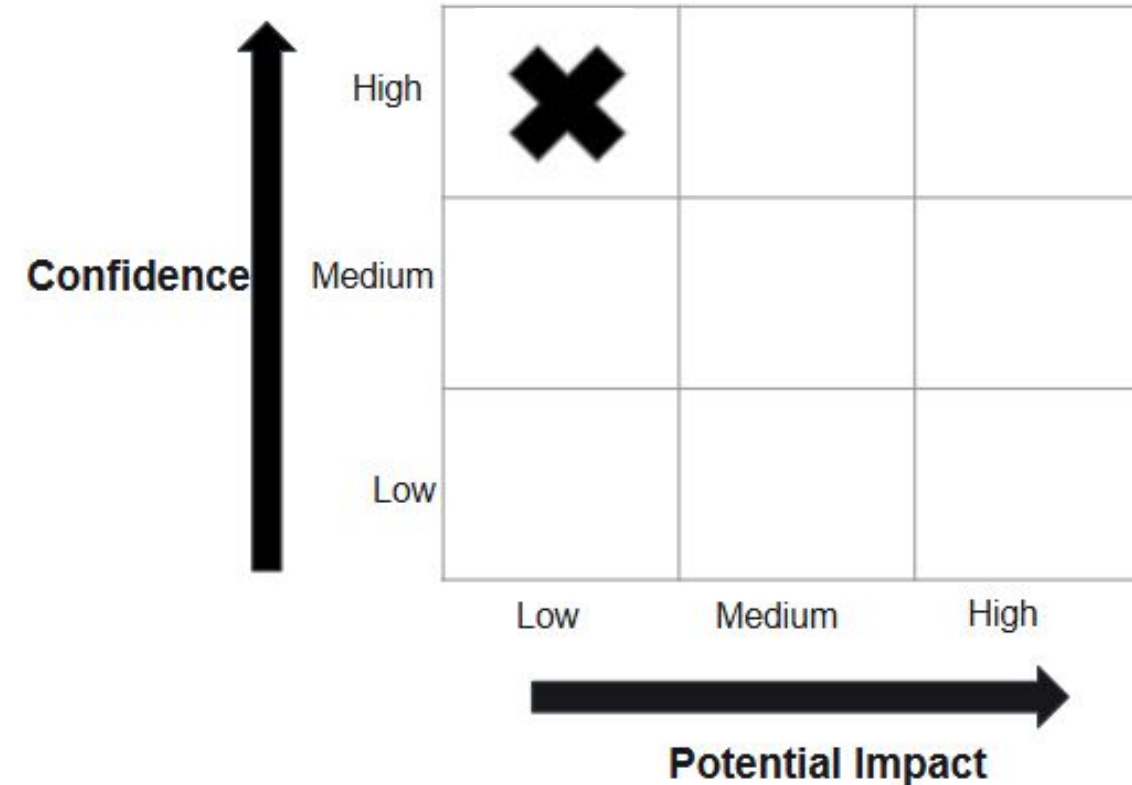
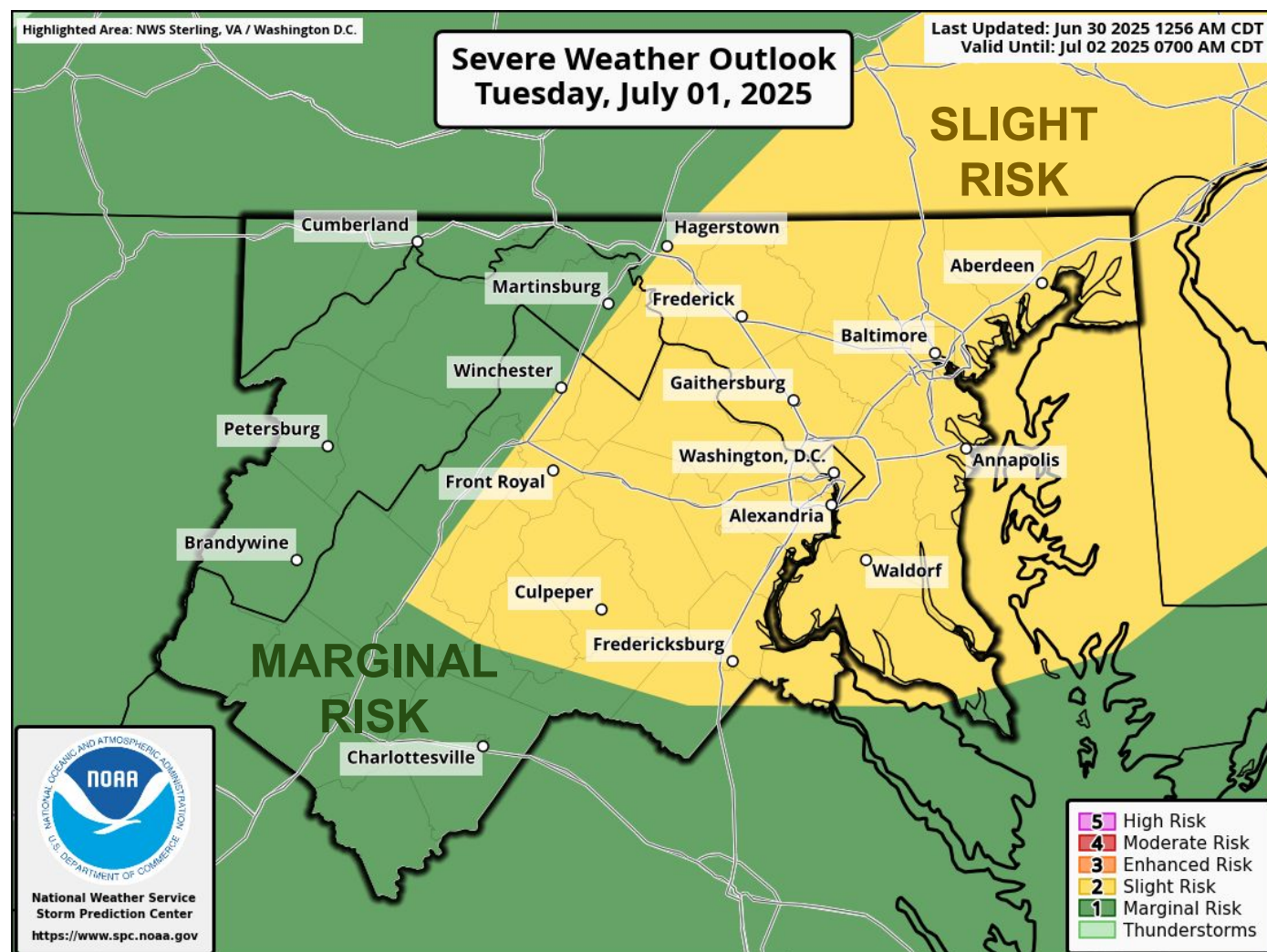

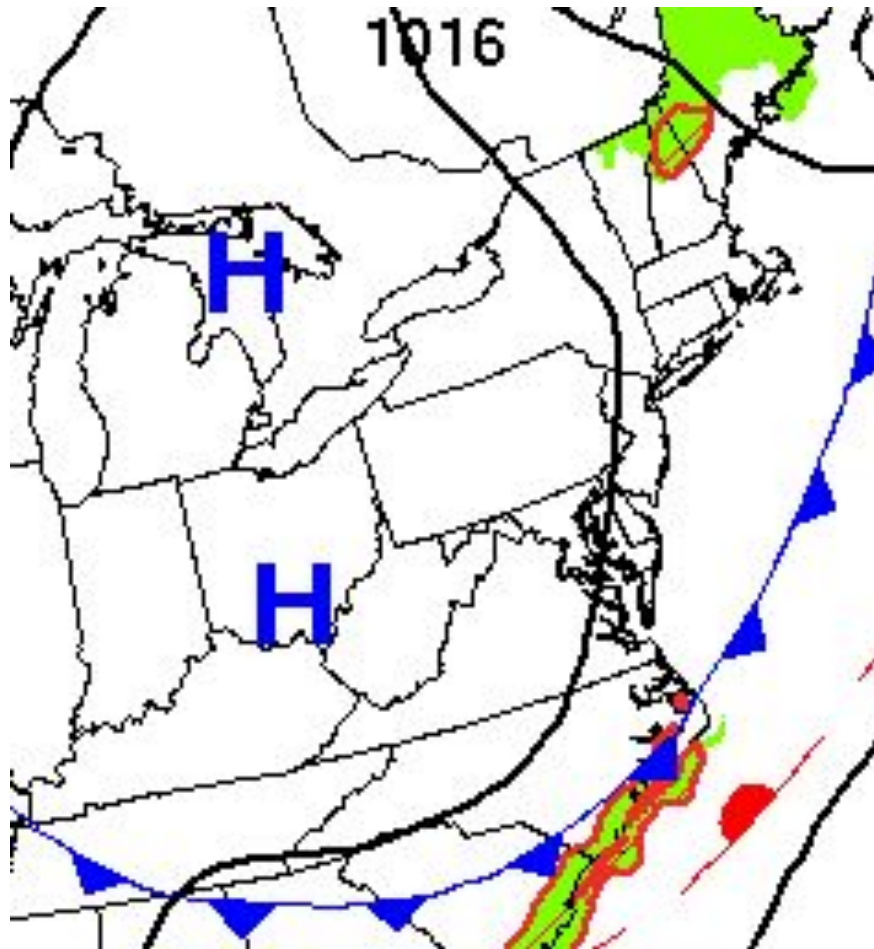
- **Threats**

 - 1 PM and 10 PM





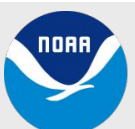
A dry, seasonable 4th expected

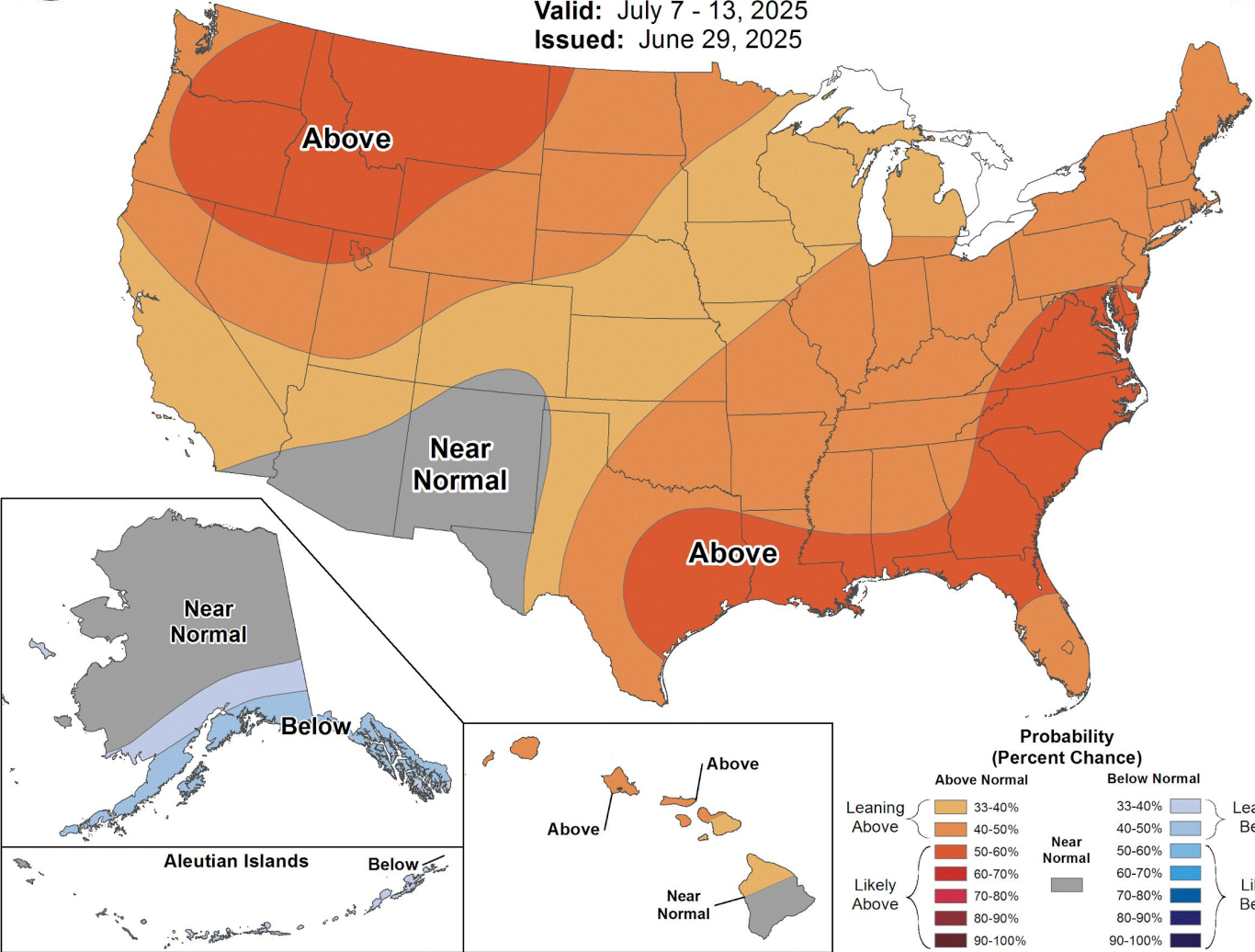

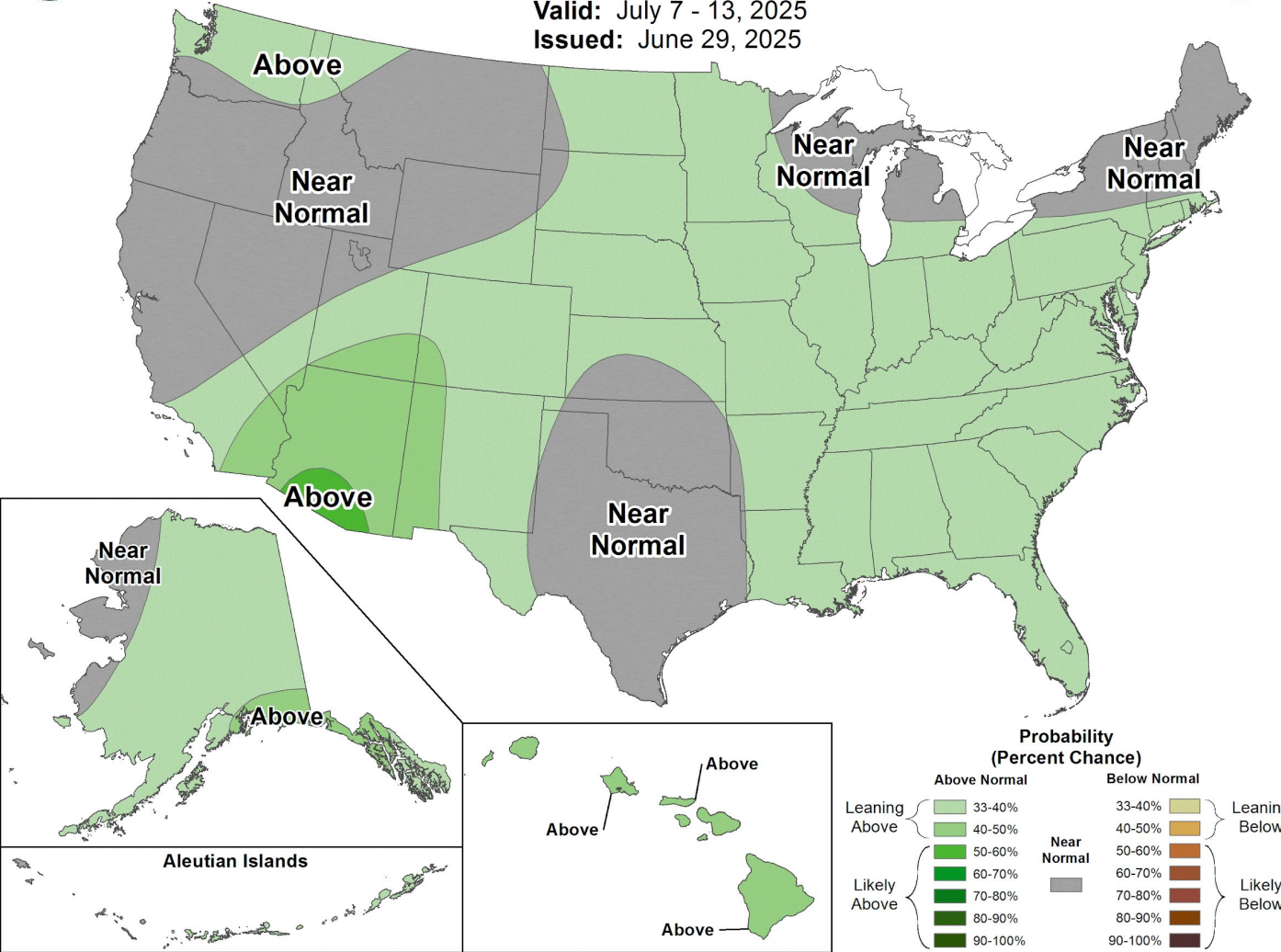
Above Normal Temperatures

Above Normal Precipitation

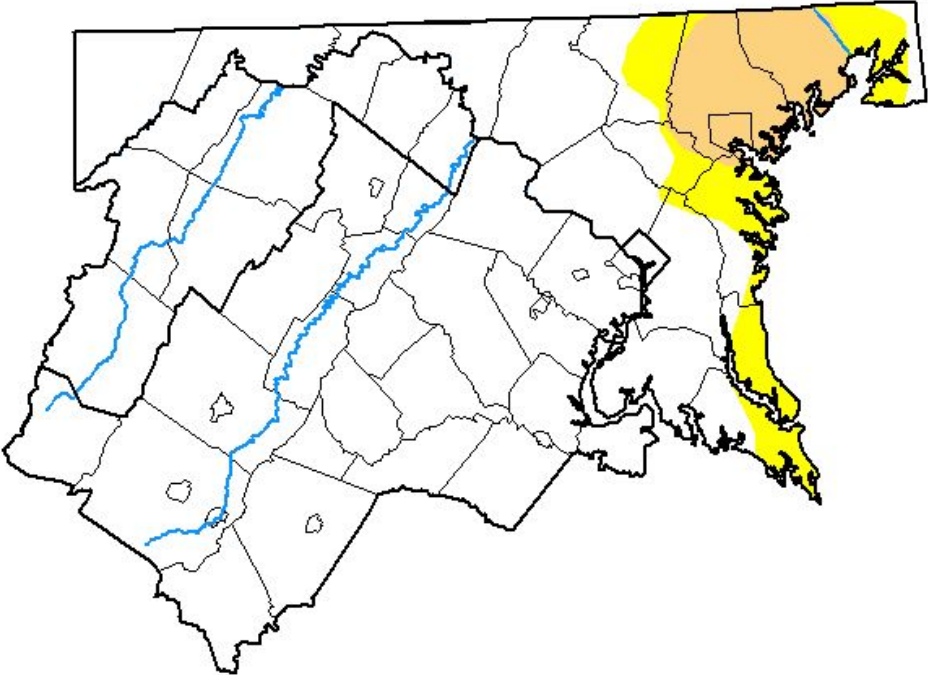

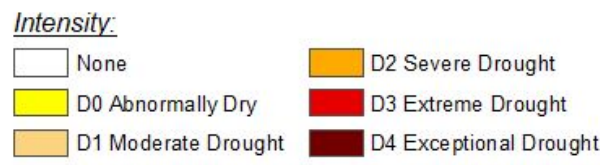

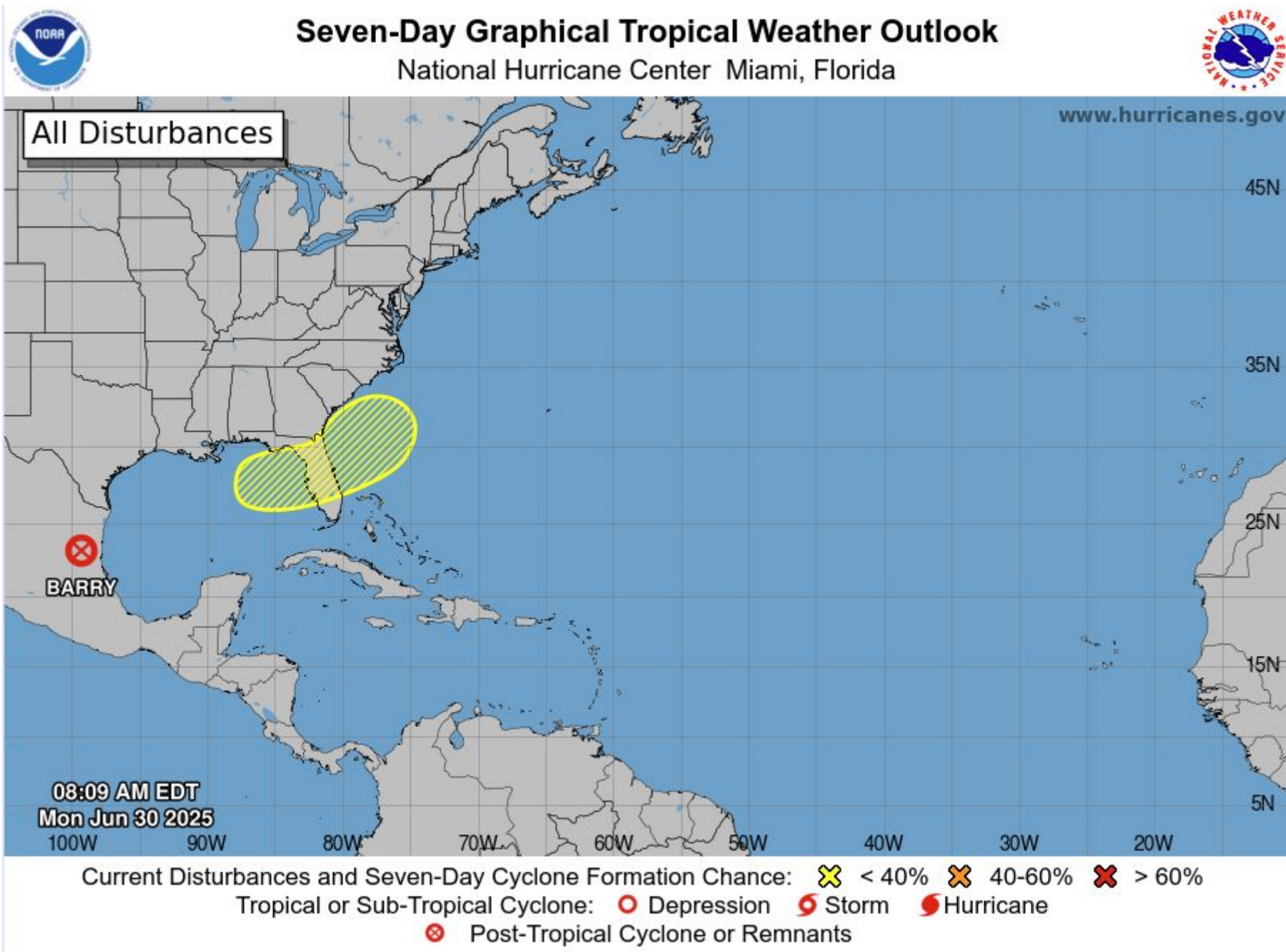
- Recent rains significantly improved drought conditions
