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- Nearly 85% of Arkansas is in drought conditions.
 - Nearly 47% of the state is in severe drought or greater (D2 or greater).
 - Recent changes have reflected characteristics of flash drought development.



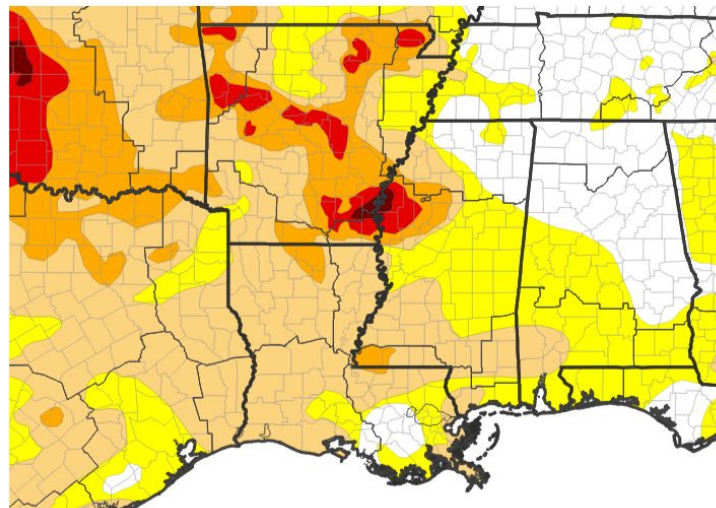

- Drought intensity and extent:
 - **D4 (Exceptional Drought)**: Portions of southeast Arkansas.
 - **D3 (Extreme Drought)**: Widely scattered areas of the state.
 - **D2 (Severe Drought)**: Scattered areas of the state.
 - **D1 (Moderate Drought)**: Many areas of the state not classified as a higher category.
 - **D0: (Abnormally Dry)**: Portions of north central and east central Arkansas.

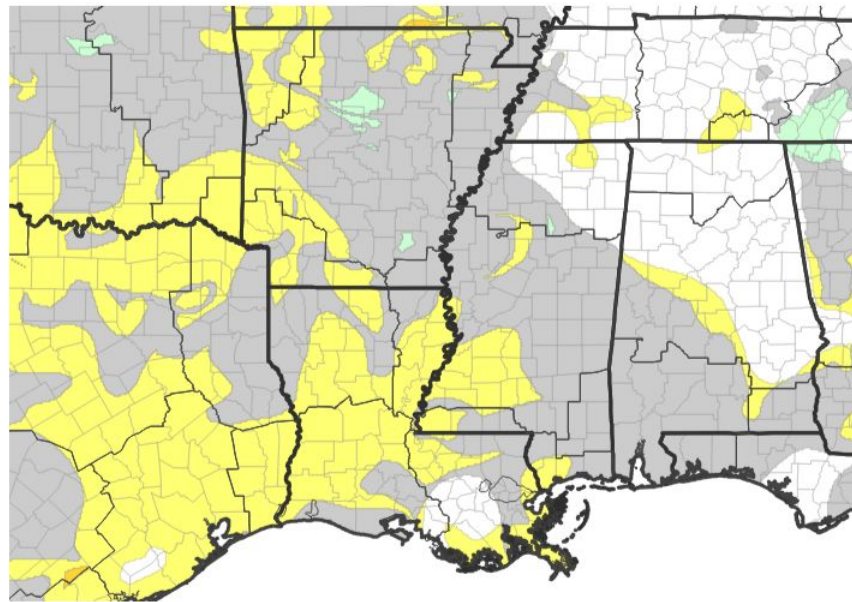


Recent Change in Drought Intensity

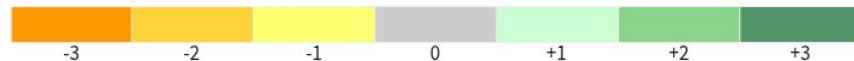

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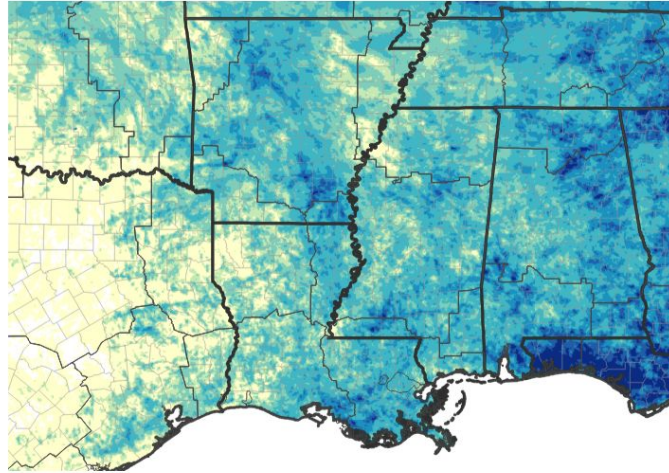




Precipitation

30-Day Precipitation Accumulations (Inches)



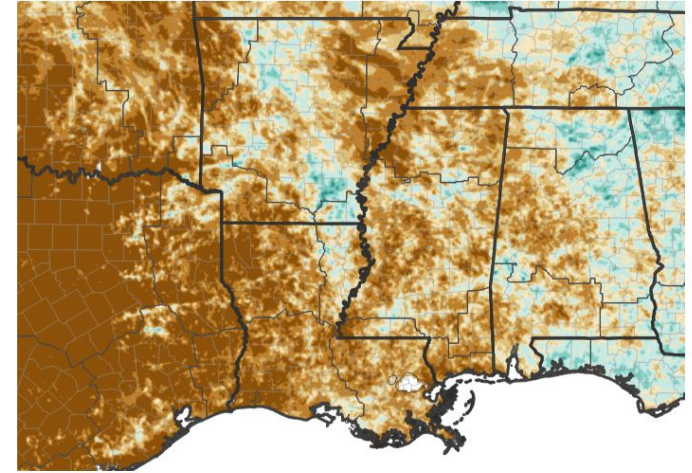
Inches of Precipitation



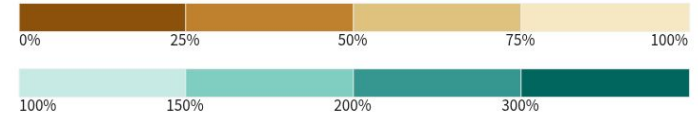

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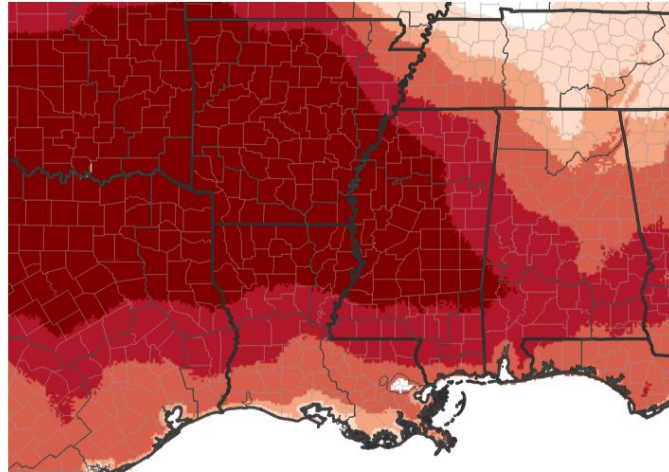




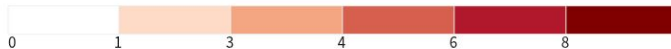
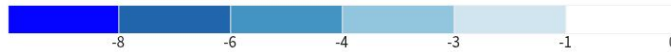
Temperature

7-Day Temperature Anomaly



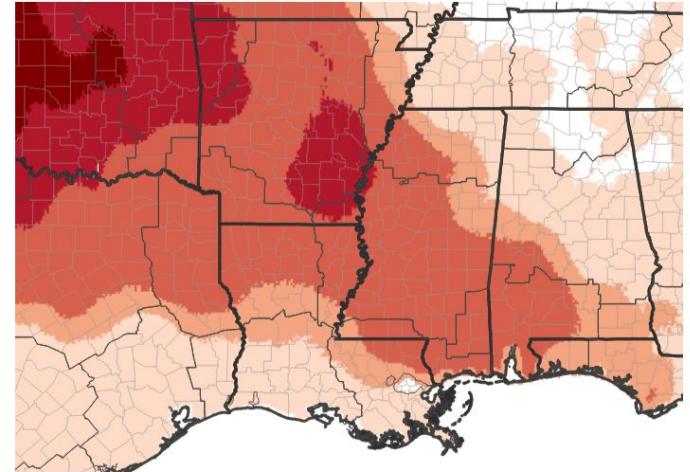
Departure from Normal Max Temperature (°F)

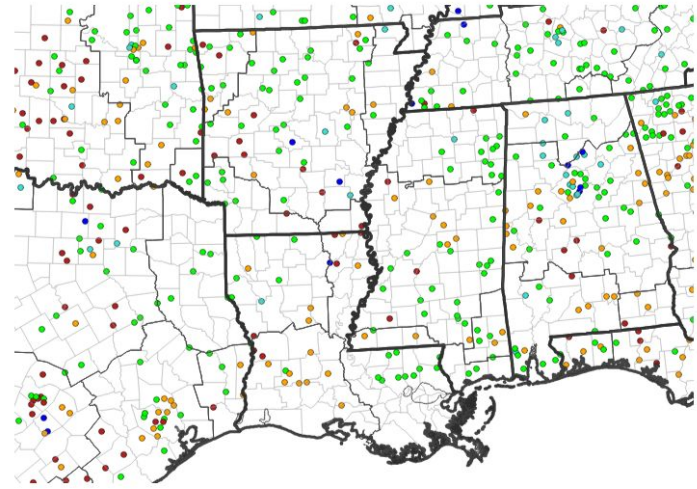




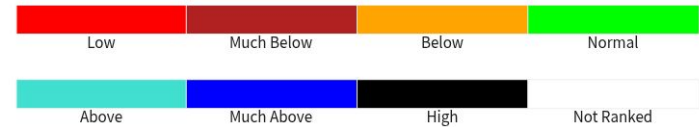
Hydrologic Conditions and Impacts

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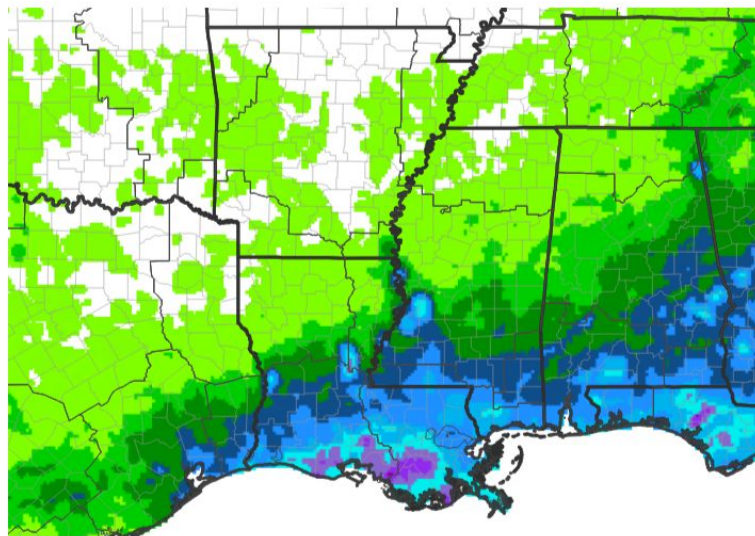




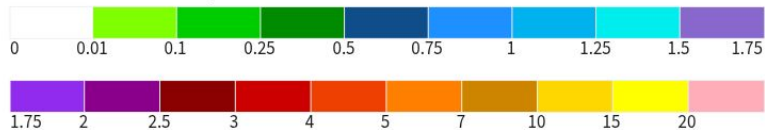
Seven Day Precipitation Forecast

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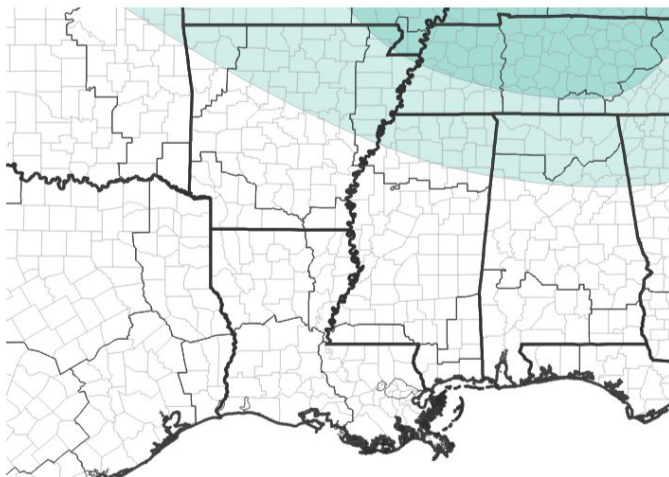

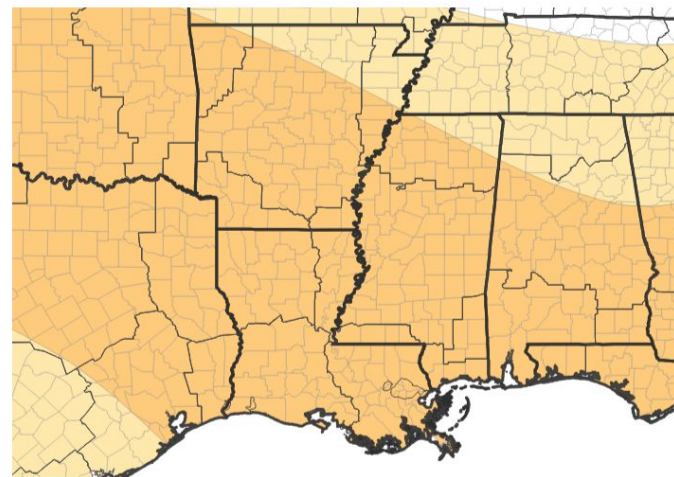

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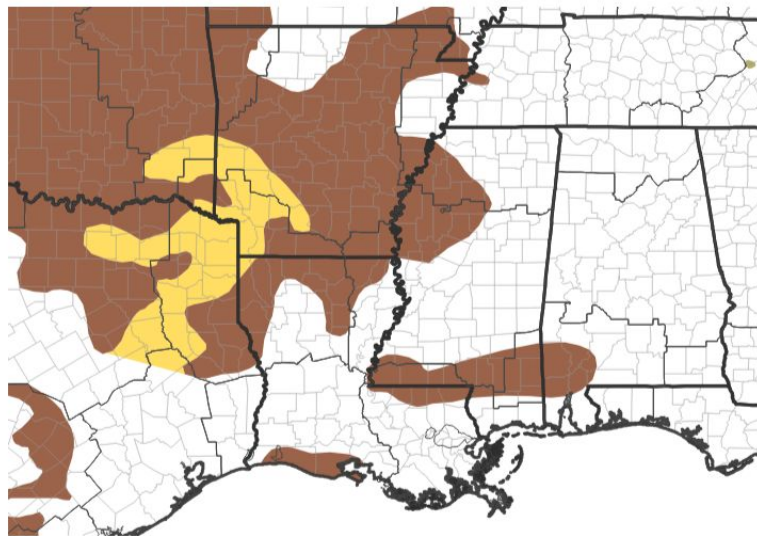


Drought Outlook
