The month of October was relatively quiet, hydrologically speaking. Only one major event was noted.

On October 7<sup>th</sup>, a HP supercell developed in Mexico and moved into Brewster County, flash flooding Terlingua Creek with a flood wave of over 4'. Portions of Big Bend National Park flash flooded as well, and several roads flooded with up to 2.5' of runoff, and were barricaded. Later that evening, a flood wave moved down the Rio Grande. At Castolon, flood stage was briefly reached for 47 minutes. Q2 precipitation estimates indicate up to nearly 3.5" of rain fell in some locations from this event.

99 locations reported rainfall for the month of October, for an average of 1.36".

Normal October precipitation for Midland International Airport is 1.77". Total precipitation for Midland International Airport for the year ending November 1<sup>st</sup> was 13.99", or 0.49" above normal.

Due to October's benign rainfall, most of the Western Low Rolling Plains and Northern Permian Basin are now abnormally dry. Southeast New Mexico has improved, with only extreme western Eddy County abnormally dry. Otherwise, the rest of the HSA remains out of drought.

Reservoir levels across the HSA averaged 35% of conservation capacity at the end of October.
