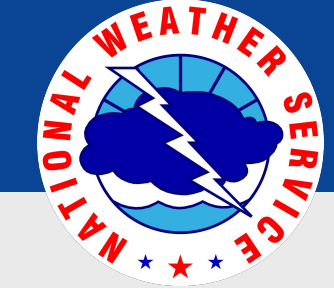

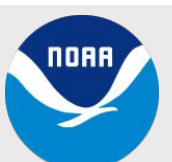

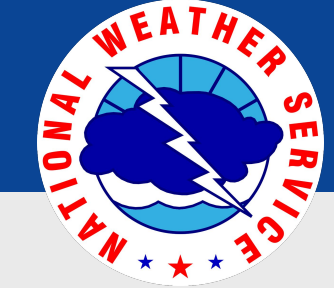


Situation Overview

June 4, 2025
3:30 PM

- **Bottom Line Up Front:** The next several days will feature severe weather chances. A **Marginal Risk (1/5)** for severe storms is in place tomorrow. In addition, a **Slight Risk (2/5)** is in place both Friday and Saturday.
- Thursday's storms will fire in the afternoon, mainly impacting areas along and north of the MS/TN border.
 - Damaging winds and large hail are the primary concerns.
- The timing and precise strength of storms on Friday and Saturday remain tricky to pinpoint. Regardless, the greatest chance for severe storms both days lies in the afternoon and evening hours. Both days will feature damaging winds and large hail as the primary threats.

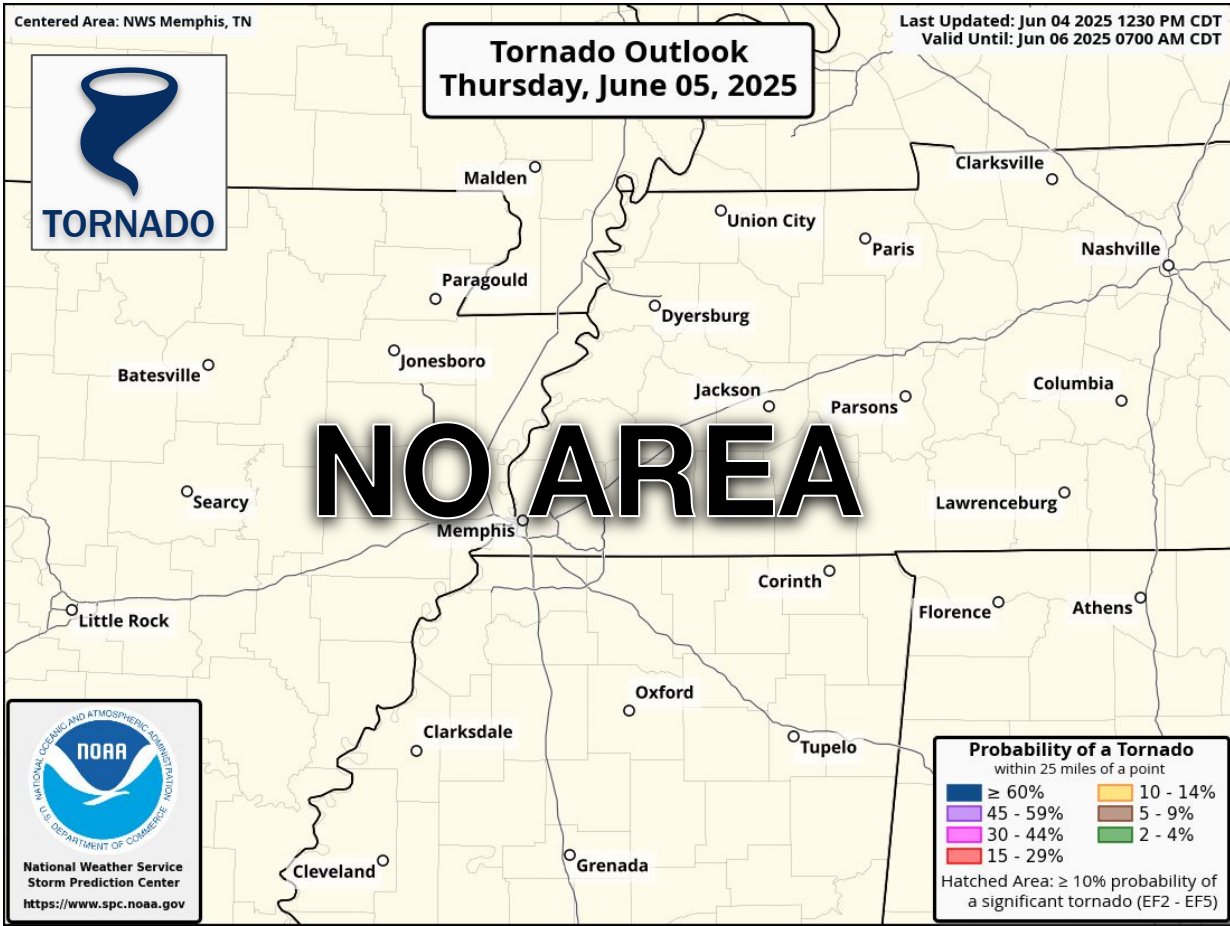
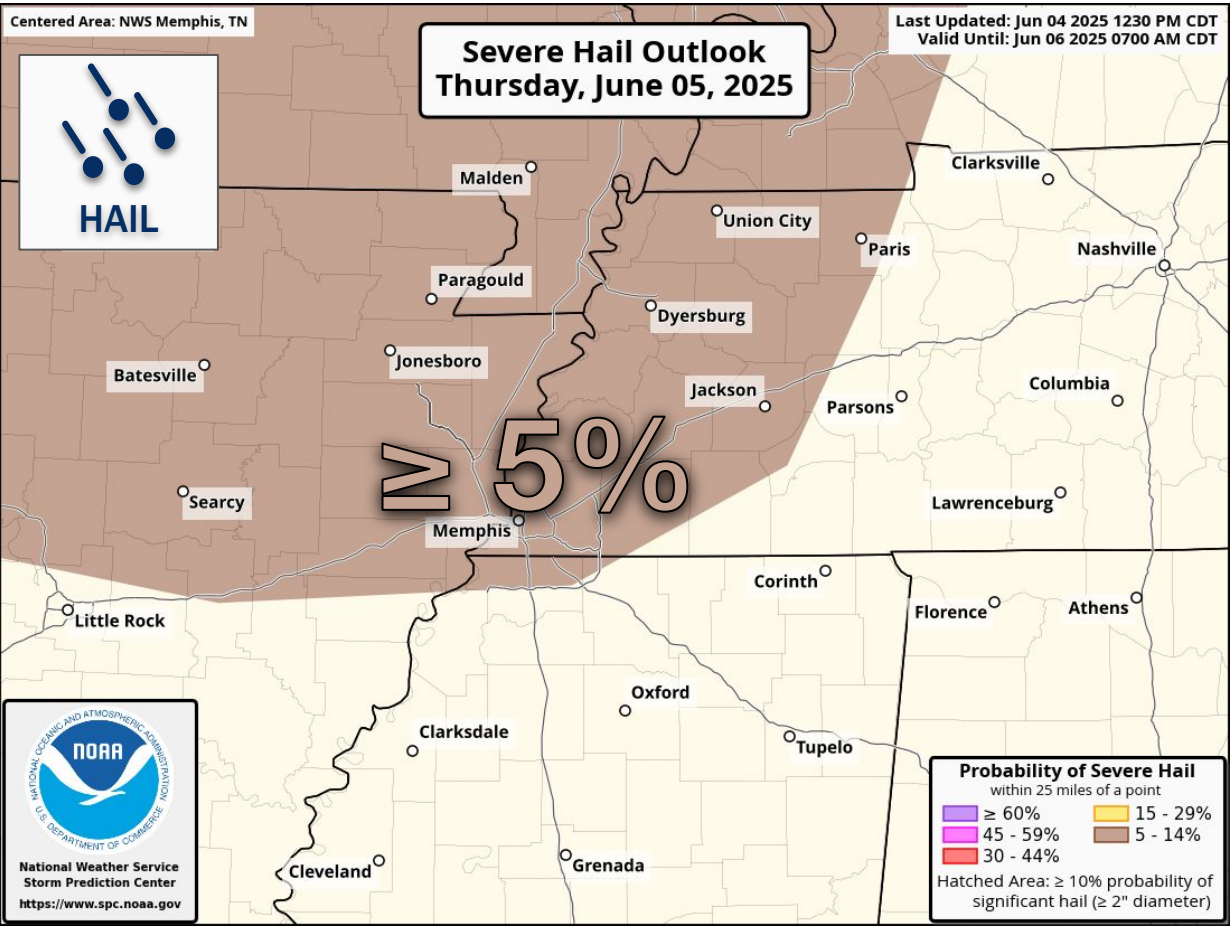
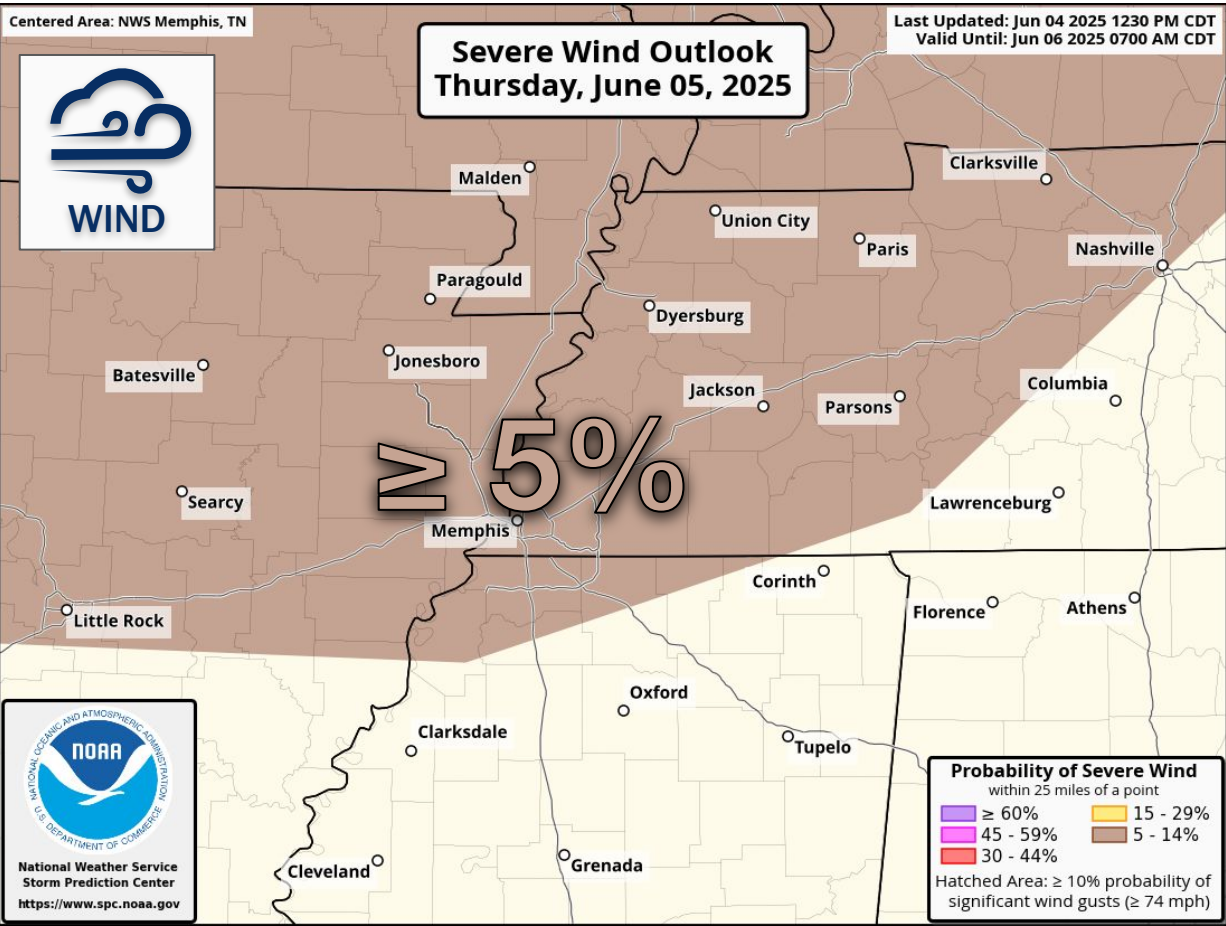


Severe Weather Probabilities

- Damaging winds and large hail are the primary threats.
- The tornado threat is very low (< 2% within 25 miles of a point).
Therefore, tornadoes are not anticipated.

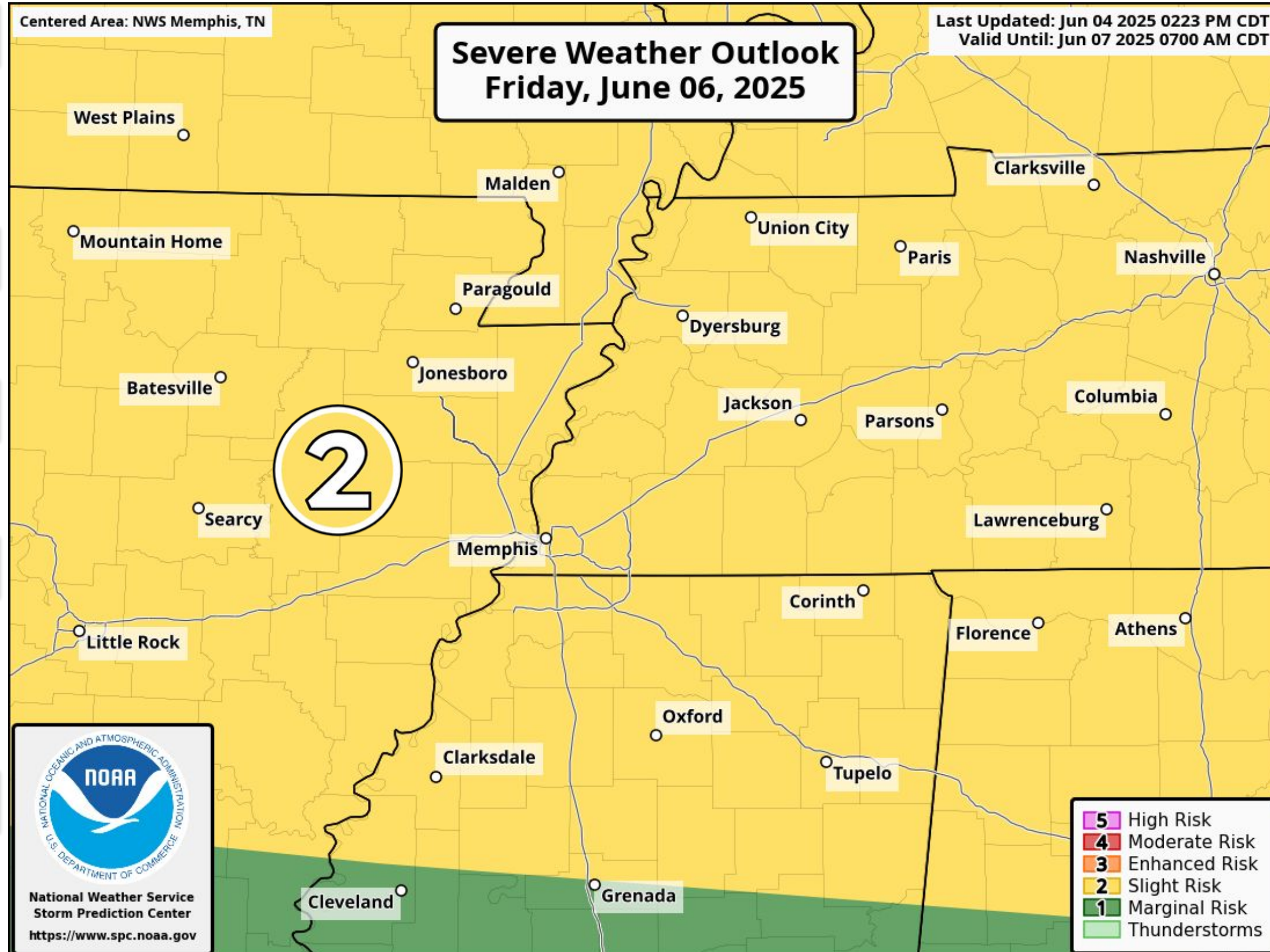

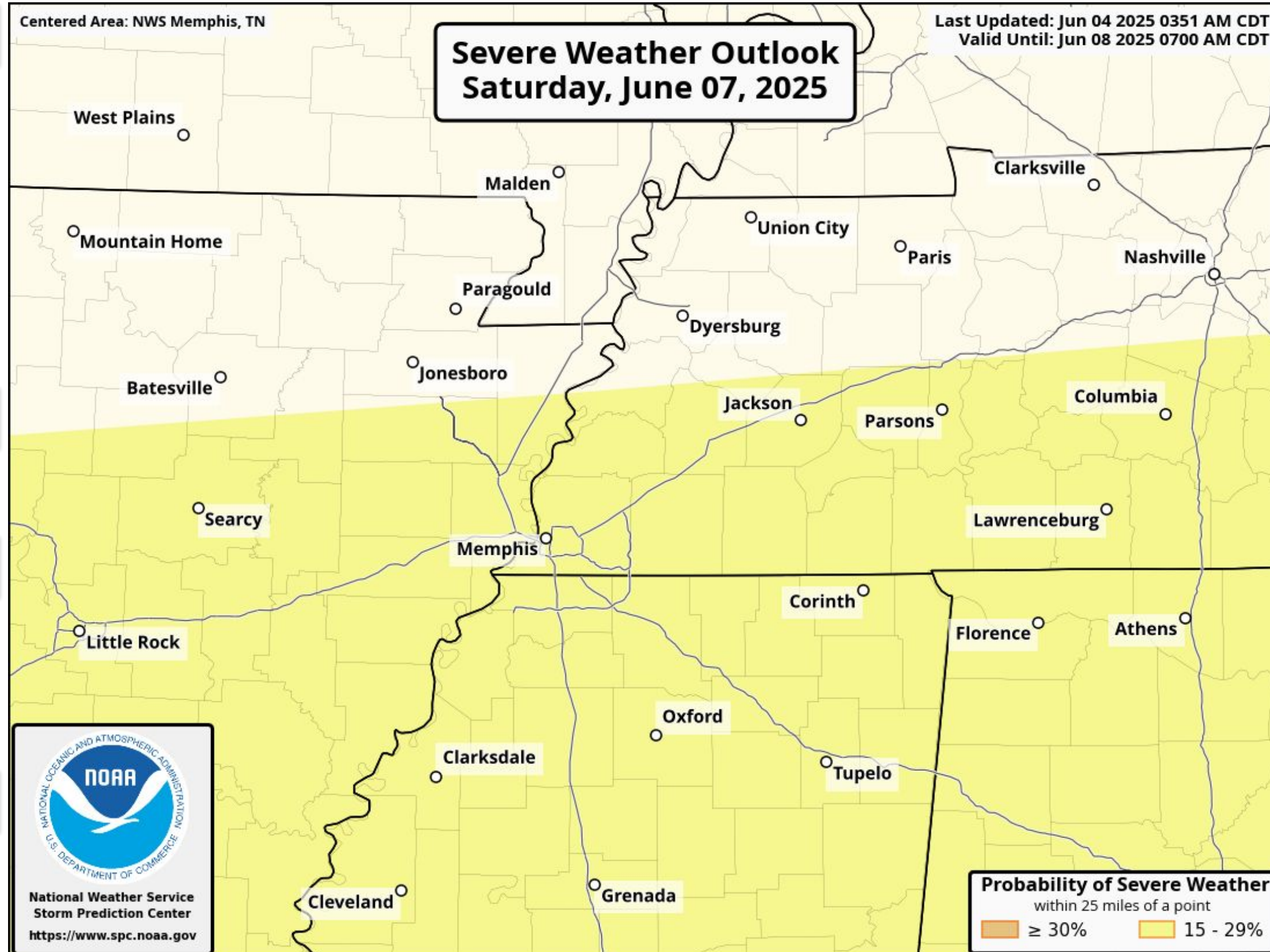

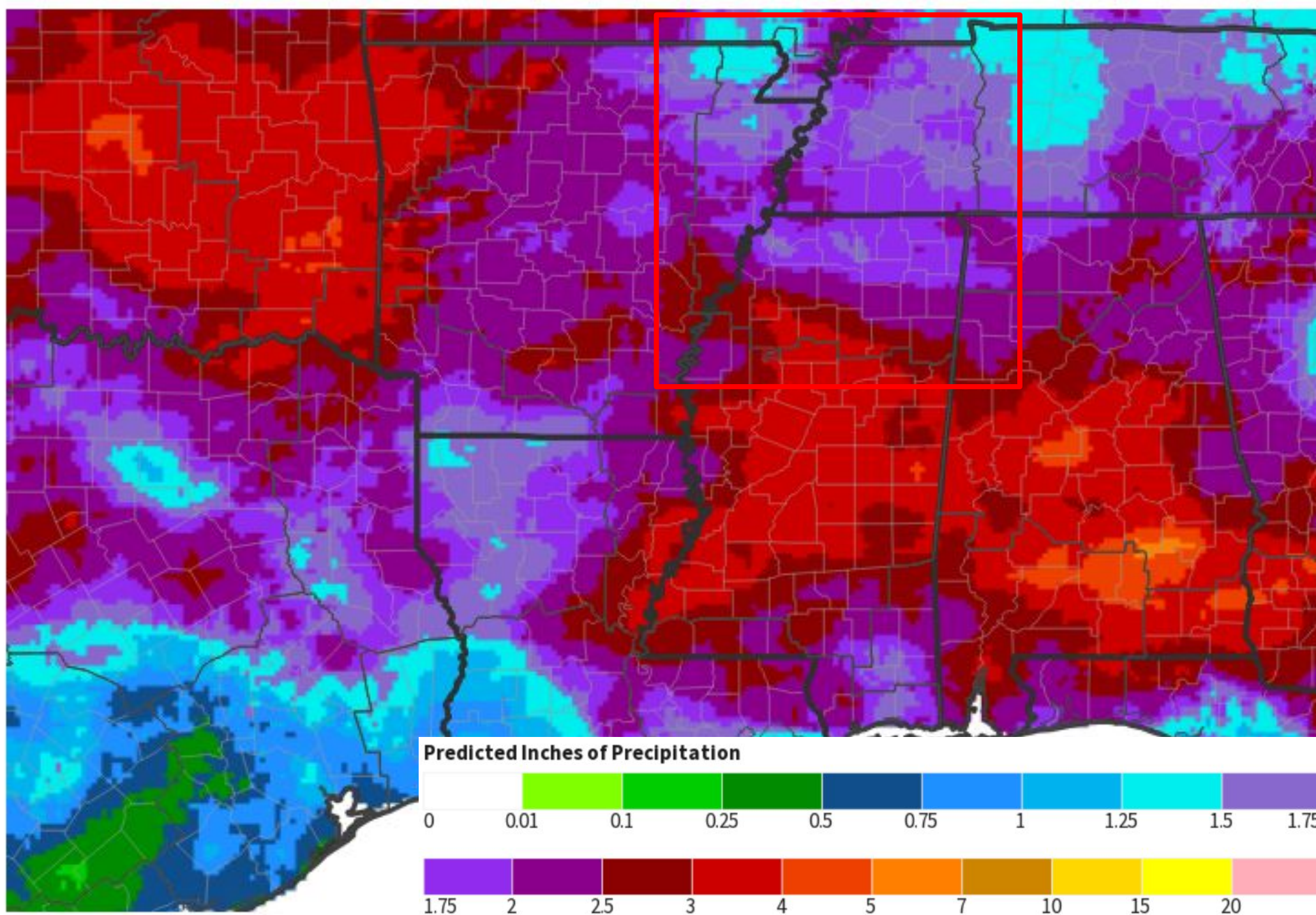


Rainfall Forecast

Accumulation – through 7 days

7-Day Quantitative Precipitation Forecast for June 3,
2025–June 10, 2025



- Multiple rounds of rain will impact the Mid-South Thursday through the weekend.
- Rainfall totals will vary from 1.5-3.0 inches.
 - Flooding of local rivers and streams is the main concern at this time.

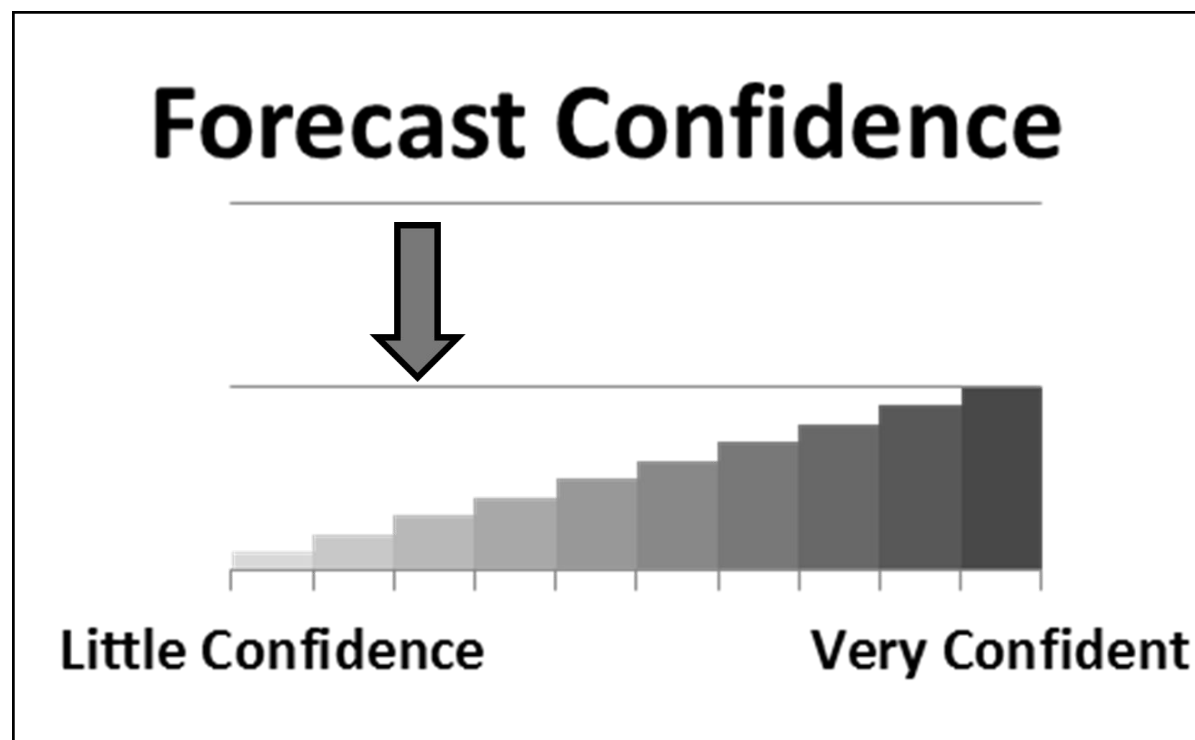

Key Takeaways

June 4, 2025
3:30 PM

- Severe storms return tomorrow. Damaging winds and large hail are the primary concerns. A **Marginal Risk (1/5)** is in place for areas along and north of the MS/TN border.
- Both Friday and Saturday are included in a **Slight Risk (2/5)** for severe storms.
- Heavy rainfall will lead to localized flooding concerns Thursday through Saturday.

STORM PLANNING TIMELINE

A few days out

If the forecast calls for severe weather in a few days, start preparing now.



Make sure that you have emergency supplies



Know your safe places



Have a family communication plan

The day before

The day before, forecast accuracy continues to improve.



Adjust plans



Make sure your phone can receive WEAs



Ensure your shelter is clean and accessible

The day of

Remain vigilant and aware of any active Watches. A Warning may be issued at a moment's notice!



Remind your family of the communication plan



Know how to evacuate and/or get to safety from wherever you are



When a Warning is issued, you may only have seconds to take action!
