


PRECIPITATION SUMMARY AND TEMPERATURE OBSERVATIONS FOR THE WASHINGTON, DC & BALTIMORE, MD AREA

MARCH 1990

ANOTHER MILD MONTH (MARCH TEMPERATURE DEPARTURE +4.4°F) HAS RESULTED IN THE WARMEST START EVER TO A YEAR IN WASHINGTON.



ALTHOUGH DCA SET FOUR CONSECUTIVE DAILY MAXIMUM TEMPERATURE RECORDS (MARCH 12–15) AND ESTABLISHED A NEW HIGHEST READING (89° F ON MARCH 12) FOR SO EARLY IN THE YEAR, THE REST OF THE MONTH SAW RELATIVELY COOL CONDITIONS, WITH TEMPERATURES AVERAGING AT OR BELOW NORMAL ON 15 DAYS AND HIGHS ONLY IN THE FORTIES ON 9 DAYS.
