The Neosho River near Commerce rose above its flood stage of 15 feet at 2:00 pm CDT on August 8th. The river crested at 19.30 feet at 6:30 am CDT on the 10th, resulting in moderate flooding. Low lying areas around Miami were flooded, including Riverview Park, and Highway 125 near the Fairgrounds was flooded. The river fell below flood stage at 1:00 am CDT on the 12th.

Multiple rounds of thunderstorms affected southeastern Kansas and northeastern Oklahoma during the first week of August. Total 7-day rainfall amounts for the area reached as much as five to eight inches. This heavy rainfall resulted in moderate flooding of the Neosho River near Commerce.
