The Poteau River near Panama rose above its flood stage of 29 feet at 12 am on November 30th. It crested at 12 am on the 1st of December at 32.20 feet. The flooding lasted into December when the river fell below its flood stage on December 2nd. Minor flooding of agricultural lands began on November 30 and would continue into the first couple of days of December.
