This tornado developed in the Arkansas River bottoms northeast of Spiro, where trees were uprooted. The tornado moved east-northeast, uprooting several more trees and damaging a barn before dissipating. It produced a radar detected tornadic debris signature from the KSRX WSR-88D. Based on this damage, maximum estimated wind in the tornado was 90 to 100 mph.				
Strong to severe thunderstorms developed across western and central Oklahoma during the afternoon of the 24th, along and ahead of an approaching cold front. The thunderstorms intensified as they moved eastward and across eastern Oklahoma during the late afternoon and evening hours. The strongest storms produced large hail up to golf ball size, damaging wind gusts, and two tornadoes.
