Severe thunderstorms moved across northeast Oklahoma during the late evening of September 6th and early morning of September 7th. Strong thunderstorm winds blew a barn down 1 mile south of Terlton, and a vehicle was damaged 6 miles north of Pawhuska when several large tree limbs were blown down onto the vehicle. A few trees and numerous large tree limbs were blown down in Mannford, where thunderstorm winds gusted to 60 miles an hour. Thunderstorm winds also gusted to 60 miles an hour 1.5 miles northwest of Pawhuska, in Pawhuska, in Cleveland, in Sand Springs, and in Jenks. Nickel size hail fell 2 miles northwest of Pawhuska and 1.5 miles northwest of Pawhuska. The thunderstorms also produced very heavy rainfall in northwest Osage County. 3 to 4 inches of rain fell in Grainola which resulted in street flooding.

An isolated severe thunderstorm moved across eastern Tulsa County and western Wagoner County during the late afternoon of September 30th. Thunderstorm winds gusted to 65 miles an hour at the intersection of 101st Street South and 145th East Avenue in Broken Arrow, and dime size hail fell near Oneta.

An isolated severe thunderstorm moved across southern Benton County and northern Washington County during the early evening of September 30th. A microburst occurred in the Apple Meadow subdivision near Apple

Blossom and Old Wire roads in the community of Bethel Heights, which is 2 miles south of Lowell. Nearly every home in the subdivision sustained some damage, and 3 homes were totally destroyed and 3 others sustained major damage. 1 minor injury occurred when a ceiling caved in on the person. Numerous trees and power lines were also blown down in Bethel Heights. Damage in Bethel Heights was estimated at 3.5 million dollars. Trees were also blown down by strong thunderstorm winds in Elm Springs.
